O: What unleashes the church?

A: Formation and Animation (Rom 8:29, 12:2; Gen 2:7; Rom 8:9-10;)

1 Corinthians 12:1-17 (NIV and NLT)

- Pneumatikos (pneuma): Wind or Breath, Things of the Spirit
- Gifts "charisma" = The Supernatural Abilities of Jesus
- Service "diakonia" = The Supernatural Humility of Jesus
- Working "energema" = The Supernatural Power of Jesus
- Manifestation "phanerosis": To breakthrough and make seen
