Some people wonder ➔ **what's the point of church?** One major reason why God established the gathering of believers was that we would hear the stories of God. 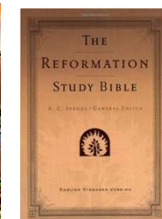
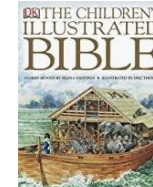
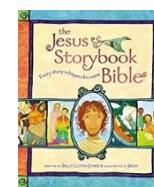
What's the point?
