Application Questions:

1. Without citing or quoting any scripture, what do you think heaven is going to be like?
2. What are your thoughts on what Jesus said in John 14:6?
3. Read Revelation 20:11-21:8 – this brings the above two questions together with a description of both Judgment Day and the New Heavens and New Earth. After reading this scripture, come back to questions 1 and 2 – Does Revelation 20:11-21:8 change how you view salvation and the afterlife?
4. If John 14:6 and Revelation 20:11-21:8 are both true – what difference does this make in your life?
5. How will you respond to these Scriptures?

John 13:36 Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, where are you going?" Jesus answered him, "Where I am going you cannot follow me now, but you will follow afterward." ³⁷ Peter said to him, "Lord, why can I not follow you now? I will lay down my life for you." ³⁸ Jesus answered, "Will you lay down your life for me? Truly, truly, I say to you, the rooster will not crow till you have denied me three times." ^{14:1} "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. ² In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. ⁴ And you know the way to where I am going." ⁵ Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷ If you had known me, you would have known my Father also. From now on you do know him and have seen him."
