







1 Kings- The Basics















- Author: Jeremiah, the prophet, but no agreement
- Time written: 560 and 540 BC / covers apx. 150-200 years
 - Written AFTER the return from exile
 - Solomon ruled apx.. 970 BC
- Purpose: History of the Kings of Israel and Judah in relation to their Covenant with God; death of David begins death of nation of Israel (all 12 tribes)
- Division of book:
 - Chapters 1-12:24 Solomon's reign over Israel, the Temple is built, then Solomon turns from God; Israel divides
 - Chapters 12:25- 16:34: The Northern Kingdom turns from God/ Kings struggle for control
 - Chapters 16:35- 22: The Northern Kingdom, Ahab and
- Main characters/events
 - King David = Beloved
 - King Solomon = Peace
 - Rehoboam/ Jeroboam
 - Elijah, the prophet = "Jehovah is my God."
 - Ahab and Jezebel



- Davidic Covenant: 2 Sam 7:11-16, 1 Chronicles 17:11- 14, 2 Chronicles 6:16, Jeremiah 23:4-6
 - Son of David (Matt. 1:1)
 - Lion of the Tribe of Judah and Root of David (Rev 5:5)
 - Solomon




- Divided Kingdom
 - North- 10 Tribes- all Kings are NOT good/ from family lines
 - South- Tribes of Judah and Benjamin- Kings are all David's family/line

Solomon- 3rd King of Israel

- Adonijah, David's son by another wife, attempts to take over while David is still alive
- David's and Bathsheba's 2nd son is Solomon
- Bathsheba and Nathan, the prophet, warn David of the attempted coup, and he immediately anoints Solomon as King over Israel
 - Likely around 18-20 yo when he becomes King
- Solomon kills Adonijah and Joab (commander) who had gone with him
- Solomon immediately asks God for wisdom
 - Why did he ask for wisdom?
 - The 2 Mothers fight over a baby
















Solomon's Palace- some say this is where the Dome of the Rock is today!

BUT THEN... SOLOMON MARRIES O

- Queen of Sheba comes to visit and gave her all she desired
- Marries Pharaoh's Daughter (Egyptian)
- Ashtoreth (aka Asherah, Ishtar and Easter),
 goddess of the Sidonians,
 Milcom (you do child sacrifice) detestable

Milcom (you do child sacrifice), detestable god of the Ammonites,

and then builds a high place for

Chemosh/Baal (destroyer/ subduer, "priest" offers human sacrifice), detestable god of Moab and Molek (you do child sacrifice), detestable god of Ammon







- Ahijah, the prophet tears the coat of Jeroboam and says that **Jeroboam** will rule over the 10 Tribes of the Northern Kingdom, and 2 will remain in Solomon's line (David's)
- **Solomon** tries to kill Jeroboam, but he flees to Egypt
- Solomon reigns x40 years, then he dies and **Rehoboam** his son succeeds him as king (of the Southern Kingdom) then the kingdom is divided

Kingdom under King Solomon







The Kingdom Divided

Southern Kingdom/Judah

Rehoboam (17 yrs.)

- Son of Solomon/ mother was Ammonite
- 2 tribes (Judah and Benjamin- though Levi likely as well)
- House of David
- Continued idol worship (2 Chron. 12:14)
- 1st acts: Tax heavily, slavery and laying a heavy yolk on people after listening to bad counselors
- People left to go North


Northern Kingdom/Israel

- Jeroboam (22 yrs.)
 - Given 10 tribes (all the rest)
 - Tribe of Ephraim
 - Fearful/ built 2 golden calves so people wouldn't go back to Jerusalem and be swayed to come back (Bethel and Dan)
 - Built shrines on high places, placed priests there and made his own 'festivals"



The Prophet Elijah!


Miracles of Elijah:

- God ceased the rain / brought drought
- Raven's fed Elijah by the brook at Kerith Ravine
- Multiplies the Widow's grain and oil
- Widow's son is resurrected

Sent to the Northern Kingdom to Ahab


- Obadiah- Ahab's palace administrator, BUT a Man of God!
- Ahab calls him the "Troubler of Israel"
- The Contest!
- Elijah calls FIRE from heaven at Mt. Carmel
- Calls rain to come- as small as a man's hand
- Outruns Ahab (? Transfigured)
- Enters a deep Depression, leaves and hides in a cavethe Lord was in the gentle whisper
 - Fed again by Ravens
 - God provides and gives him 3 tasks
 - Anoint Hazael king Syria
 - Anoint Jehu king of Israel
 - Anoint Elisha to take your place

Jesus and the Holy Spirit in 1 Kings

- David's legacy = Jesus' genealogy
- Solomon = Man of peace/ wiser than any other man
- Jesus = Prince of Peace, stories would be more than all the books in the world
- Queen of Sheba (of the South)- sat the feet of Solomon, but something greater than Solomon is here (Luke 11:31)
- The Temple becomes the residence of the Holy Spirit (1 Kings 8:10-13)
 - The Ark is brought and the cloud and the glory of the Lord fill the Temple
 - We are now the temple: (1 Cor. 6:19, 1 Peter 2:5, 1 Cor. 3:9)
- Elijah, the prophet- in Jesus' day, some say he or John the Baptist is Elijah
 - The POWER of the Lord came upon Elijah (Chp. 18)
- Rejecting God brings death The Kingdom is split: Live by the world or live by the Spirit

Other Lessons:

Idolatry will have consequences
God loves us even through emotional distress of depression, loneliness
and feelings of unworthiness

Book of 2 Kings- The Basics

Author: likely Jeremiah

Time written: 560-540 BC

 Purpose: History of Israel and Judah leading to Captivity of both

- Division of book:
 - Chapters 1-10: Elisha and miracles
 - Chapters 11-16: Kings of North and South rule Israel and Judah
 - Chapter 17: Israel falls to Assyria
 - Chapter 18-23: Judah reforms but then falls to Babylon
- Main characters/events
 - Elisha = God is Salvation
 - Kings of Israel/Judah
 - Various prophets
 - Captivity of both the Northern and Southern Kingdoms



The Prophet Elisha!

- Loves Elijah as a father and refuses to leave him
- Requests a double portion of Elijah's spirit/ calling
- If you see me when I am taken up, you will get what you ask
- Chariot of Fire and Horses take Elijah in a whirlwind
- "My father, my father"... Elisha takes the cloak, then strikes the Jordan River- which parts and he crosses
- The Spirit of Elijah rests on Elisha
- He is now the prophet to the people of Israel (12 tribes)



Elisha is BUSY! Miracles galore!

- Healing of the waters of Jericho (2 Kings 2:19-21)
- Jeered by youth, then called a curse and 42 were mauled by bears (2 Kings 2:23-25)
- Multiplied a widow's oil (2 Kings 4:1-7)
- Prophesied a son for a wealthy Shunnamite family, then later resurrected the son (2 Kings 4:8-37)
- Removed poison from a pot of stew (2 Kings 4:38-41)
- Multiplied 20 barley loaves to feed 100 men (2 Kings 4:42-44)
- Cured Naaman of Leprosy (2 Kings 5), but his servant Gehazi lies and gets the leprosy instead
- Made a borrowed ax head float (2 Kings 6:1-7)
- Elisha hears the words spoken by the King of Aram in his bedroom
- Aram's army is struck with confusion and heard chariots and horses
- and the servant's eyes are opened to spiritual warriors/ horses and chariots of fire!
- Baal worship eradicated (2 Kings 10:28)

Most miracles are of helpfulness and blessing





Jezebel



Jehu is anointed King and is told to destroy Ahab's family

- He starts in Jezreel with Jezebel
- He calls up to 3 eunuchs and they "throw her down" where she is trampled by horses
- Jehu goes in to eat and drink and thinks he should bury her anyway, but when they go out, there is nothing left of her but skull, feet and hands because she has been eaten by dogs
- He continues to kill the rest of the family AND the priests of Baal

"Spirit" of Jezebel

- Synonymous with evil; epitome of the wicked/ evil woman
- Introduced Baal worship to the Northern Kingdom = the occult, false prophets and witchcraft;
- Comparison to Jezebel = pagan, manipulative, seductive, misleading others into idolatry and sexual immorality, controlling
- Some see makeup as a vice because of these passages

Revelation 2: 18-29 To the church in Thyatira = unceasing sacrifice

- Love and faith, service and perseverance, doing more than you did at first
- You tolerate that woman Jezebel, who calls herself a prophet, but misleads people into sexual immorality and eating food sacrificed to idols.... AND unrepentant

Elisha's Death

Elisha has a chronic illness:

- 2 Kings 13: ¹⁴ Now when Elisha had fallen sick with the illness of which he was to die....
- Elisha later died and was buried
- People threw a man's body into Elisha's tomb and when the body touched his bones, the man was resurrected!

Ecclesiastes 7:14:



Northern Kingdom's Captivity

King Ahaz of Judah

 Replaces the bronze altar and places a "new altar" at the front of the temple of the Lord

King Hoshea in Israel

- Attacked by the King of Assyria, Samaria is captured and the Israelites are deported to Assyria- because they had sinned against the Lord 722 BC
 - Set up sacred stones and Asherah polies
 - Burned incense
 - Worshiped idols
 - Rejected His decrees and the covenant he had made with their ancestors
 - Followed worthless idols
 - Imitated the nations around them
 - Bowed down to the starry hosts and worshiped Baal
 - Practiced divination and sought omens
 - Sold themselves to do evil
- Resettled other people to Samaria and the Northern Kingdom who each brought their own gods and evil practices



Here is a sampling of what the Assyrian kings documented:

- Cut off their hands and fingers. Others cut off their noses, ears and fingers. Put out many of their eyes.
- Skin them alive and put their skin on the walls of the cities they conquered.
- Cut off their heads and put them on stakes and line the roads to their city.
- Swing babies by their ankles and crack their heads against a stone wall.
- · Formed pillars of their corpses.
- · Impaled men on stakes against their city gate.
- "I pierced his chin with my keen hand dagger. Through his jaw I passed a rope, put a dog chain upon him and made him occupy a kennel of the east gate of the inner of Nineveh."
- "I cut off their members and had them carried about as an object lesson for all lands."

No wonder Jonah didn't want to go



King Hezekiah and Prophet Isaiah

- King Hezekiah:
 - Removes ALL the high places, cuts down Asherah poles and removes idolatry
- King Senecherab of Assyria tries to take Jerusalem/ Southern Kingdom as he has already taken Northern Kingdom) <u>but is stopped</u>
- Hezekiah repents and prays and God gives him 15 more years AND God moves back the sundial (the sun's shadow)
- When the King of Babylon hears of Hezekiah's illness, he sends his son Marduk-Baladan and Hezekiah is full of pride and <u>shows him</u> <u>everything</u>: "There was nothing in his palace or in all his kingdom that Hezekiah did not show them." (20:13)
- Isaiah comes and prophesies that Hezekiah's descendants will be eunuchs in Babylon, but he is so selfish he says, "at least it's not me, I will live at peace"
- Manasseh, his son rebuilds the high places, makes altars to Baal and sacrifices his own son
- Josiah becomes king at 8 yrs. old

Captivity of the Southern Kingdom, Judah

- Josiah is spared and they celebrate the Passover
- Josiah is killed by Pharaoh-Necho as he made an allegiance with Assyria
- Last chapters, Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon comes to Jerusalem and Jehoiakim became his vassal for 3 years and as far west as Egypt
- Nebuchadnezzar now invades Jerusalem, takes Jehoiachin prisoner and takes the gold from Solomon's temple; he carries all the people into exile into Babylon and makes Zedekiah king (J's uncle)
- Zedekiah later tries to rebel against Nebuchadnezzar as he is starving the remnant; he
 is captured and his sons are killed in front of him, then they put his eyes out and take
 him to Babylon
- Nebuchadnezzar then sets fire to the temple, the royal palace and all the houses



Jesus and the Holy Spirit in 2 Kings


- Miracles of Elisha: multiplying bread, healing leprosy and many illustrate God's compassion toward those deemed "unworthy" of God's grace- poor, weak, oppressed, Samaritans, and Gentiles.
- Great Physician for the unclean king and leper
- God is so faithful and sends messenger after messenger to save people!


Lessons learned:

- 1. The Lord will judge unfaithfulness/ disobedience.
- 2. The word of Prophets will come to pass.
- The Lord is faithful and kept promise to House of David, despite disobedience.

Lineage of Jesus, the Messiah- Matthew 1

1 This is the genealogy of Jesus the Messiah the son of David, the son of Abraham: ² Abraham was the father of Isaac, Isaac the father of Jacob, Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers, ³ Judah the father of Perez and Zerah, whose mother was Tamar, Perez the father of Hezron, Hezron the father of Ram, ⁴ Ram the father of Amminadab, Amminadab the father of Nahshon, Nahshon the father of Salmon,

⁵ Salmon the father of **Boaz**, whose mother was **Rahab**, Boaz the father of Obed, whose mother was **Ruth**, Obed the father of Jesse, ⁶ and Jesse the **father of King David**.

David was the father of Solomon, **whose mother had been Uriah's wife**, ⁷ Solomon the father of Rehoboam, Rehoboam the father of Abijah, Abijah the father of Asa, ⁸ Asa the father of Jehoshaphat, Jehoshaphat the father of Jehoram, Jehoram the father of Uzziah, ⁹ Uzziah the father of Jotham, Jotham the father of Ahaz, Ahaz the father of Hezekiah, ¹⁰ Hezekiah the father of Manasseh, Manasseh the father of Amon, Amon the father of Josiah, ¹¹ and Josiah the father of Jeconiah and his brothers **at the time of the exile** to **Babylon**.

¹² After the exile to Babylon: Jeconiah was the father of Shealtiel, Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel, ¹³ Zerubbabel the father of Abihud, Abihud the father of Eliakim, Eliakim the father of Azor, ¹⁴ Azor the father of Zadok, Zadok the father of Akim, Akim the father of Elihud, ¹⁵ Elihud the father of Eleazar, Eleazar the father of Matthan, Matthan the father of Jacob, ¹⁶ and Jacob the father of Joseph, the husband of Mary, and Mary was the mother of Jesus who is called the Messiah.
