
Ecclesiastes-THE BASICS

Author: Solomon

Time written: Ruled 971-931 BC, so apx. 950 BC?

 Purpose: The futility of human existence apart from God

- Division of book:
 - Chapters 1-7: Worldly things under the SUN (apart from God)
 - Chapters 8-12- "How a life SHOULD be lived" (a life with and under God)
- Events
 - The Preacher
 - Preacher's search "under the sun"
 - The frailty of life and the end of the Preacher's search
 - Acknowledgement of God

- Materialism (2:19-20)







Your limbs will tremble with age, and your strong legs will grow weak. Your teeth will be too few to do their work, and you will be blind, too. You will be afraid of heights and of falling, white haired and withered, dragging along without any sexual desire. You will be standing at death's door. Jesus in Ecclesiastes!

- We should all recognize the "vanity" of all things "under the sun" except for those things done for and with Christ!
- Ecclesiastes shows us the frustration and constant yearning for God in a fallen world! Jesus ends this frustration ... and is the wisdom of God that "fills" this frustration!
 - But to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, CHRIST is the POWER of GOD and the WISDOM of God. – 1 Corinthians 1:24
- God of all Seasons: 3:1-8
- Eternal Creator who has placed eternity in the hearts of His creatures (3:9-14)
- Future Judge of all People (11:9 and 12:14)
- All Wise Shepherd (12:11)

Time written: Apx. 950 BC



• **Purpose:** Praises the glories and delights of love between a man and a woman/ marriage, an allegory of Christ and the Church AND Israel and God;

Division of book:

• SoS 1:1-3:5 The bride thinks about Her Beloved (? Solomon)


SoS 3:6-5:1 The bride accepts the betrothal and looks forward to marriage

• SoS 5:2- 6:3 The bride dreams of losing Her Beloved

SoS 6:4- 8:14 The bride and her Beloved praise each other in passionate love

Main Characters and Events

- The Shulamite
- The Daughters of Jerusalem
- The Bridegroom/ Her Beloved




Themes in the Song of Songs

- It's an Opera!
- Is this Shulamite woman is Abishaq, who nursed David in his final days?

 - Another picture of a King, Good Shepherd and Protector of his Bride





· Author: Isaiah

• Time written: 740-680 BC



- Division of book:
 - Chapters 1-39 Sins of the nation of Israel and God's judgement for that sin
 - Chapters 40-66 Message of comfort, hope, and restoration. God's faithfulness that He will keep His covenant
 - Chapters 40-48- His Supremacy
 - Chapters 49-53- The Servant
 - Chapters 54-66- The Future
- Main Characters/ Events
 - Isaiah = the salvation of God
 - Various Kings
 - Southern Kingdom of Judah
 - Messiah, Jesus

Christ in Isaiah	His first and second advents are prophesied throughout the book (child of a virgin in 7:14, the shoot from the stem of Jesse in chapter 11, the Suffering Servant in chapter 53).				

Isaiah-Summary

- Son of Amoz, many say in his 30's when he began to Prophesy
- Married to a prophetess and had 2 sons (Shear-Jashub, a remnant will return-7:3 / Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz, quickly to the plunder/ the spoil speeds, 8:3)
- First of 17 books of Prophets- considered a "major" prophet and often considered the greatest
- Pre-exile prophet who wrote during 4 Kings of the Southern Kingdom of Judah: Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah
- Likely met his death under a 5th King, evil King Manasseh- many say his death is described in Hebrews 11:37, the prophet who was "sawn in two."
- Likely lived in Jerusalem
- The Northern Kingdom was taken into captivity by Assyria shortly after
- 66 Chapters-? Correspond to the 66 Books of the Bible
 - 1-39- Correspond to Old Testament
 - 40-66- Correspond to New Testament
 - 40-48- Supremacy of the Lord
 - 49-53- The Servant of the Lord
 - 54-66- The Coming of the Lord

MORE Summary:)

- Primary focus is the coming judgment on the Southern Kingdom due to idolatry, apostasy and wickedness
- One of few chapters in the Bible where we SEE the Throne of God and His Glory and Holiness / God CANNOT allow sin to go unpunished (Isaiah 6)
- Rise and Fall of Babylonian Empire (Isaiah 36-39)- King Hezekiah
- Return of the people under King Cyrus
- God's redemptive love for his people after they continued to turn from Him
- Messiah will rule/ reign in justice/ righteousness
- Prophesies Jesus' birth, death and final redemption for Israel... and us! (Isaiah 7, Isaiah 52-53, Isaiah 63, 65-66)
- In Luke, Jesus reads Isaiah 61 when He says, "TODAY, this scripture is fulfilled!".... But IS IT?



ISAIAH PREDICTED IF JUDAH CONTINUED TO DISOBEY, THEY WOULD BE EXILED!

Judgment of God: 1-39

- Northern Kingdom and threat of Assyria
- Judah/ Jerusalem
- Isaiah's Call-Isaiah 6
- Lucifer's fall- Isaiah 14 discuss in Ezekiel
- Egypt/Cush: Walk naked for 3 years = Isaiah 20:1-5
- Isaiah & King Hezekiah: Isaiah 36-39
 - Sennecherib's (Assyria) defeat
 - Power of Prayer
 - God keeps His covenant with His people!
 - GOD will deal with the disobedient- not us :)
- Rise and Fall of the new enemy, Babylon



-> GOD WILL SEND JUDAH INTO EXILE ... BUT HE WILL RESTORE THEM

THE EVIL NATIONS WILL BE PUNISHED ... AND A MESSIAH IS COMING

The Servant Chapters: 49-53

- The 4 "Songs" show the service, suffering, and exaltation of the meek and gentle Servant of the Lord, the Messiah.
- He is a royal figure and the high priest, atoning for the sins of the world.
- Isaiah predicts that this Servant of the Lord would deliver the world from the prison of sin. The terminology of the ancient Near East:
 - A servant was a "trusted envoy," a "confidential representative," or "one who is chosen."
- The Servant Songs are found in:
 - Isaiah 42:1-9 God's Spirit, Servant, and Delight
 - Isaiah 49:1-13
 Servant, Light to the Gentiles
 - Isaiah 50: 4-11
 Persecuted, yet obedient
 - Isaiah 52: 13- 53:12 Suffering and Triumph

The Suffering Servant

He was not violent "nor was any deceit in His mouth" (53:9), yet...

He was "marred" (52:14)

He was undesired (53:2)

He was "despised" (53:3)

He was "rejected" (53:3)

He was "acquainted with grief" (53:3)


He was esteemed not (53:3)

He was the bearer of sorrow (53:4)

He was "stricken" (53:4)

He was "smitten" (53:4, 8)

He was "afflicted" (53:4)



He was "numbered with the transgressors" (53:12)

He was "an offering for sin" (53:10)

He was the "bearer of iniquity"

(53:6, 11-12)

He was "wounded" (53:5)

He was "bruised" (53:5, 10)

He was "chastised" (53:5)

He was scourged (53:5)

He was "oppressed" (53:7)

He was "afflicted" (53:7)

He was "silent" (53:7)

He was "taken" (53:8)

He was "cut off" (53:8)


He was buried (53:9)

Jesus and the Holy Spirit in Isaiah!

- The most comprehensive prophetic picture of Jesus Christ in the OT:
 - The announcement of His coming Isaiah 40:3-5
 - His virgin birth Isaiah 7:14
 - His proclamation of the good news Isaiah 61:1
 - His sacrificial death Isaiah 52:13–53:12
 - His return to claim His own Isaiah 60:2–3
- The Holy One of Israel- appears more than 12x speaking of the Lord's majesty and glory and hatred of wickedness and evil
- The Paradox of the Suffering Savior and the Coming Messiah!
 - Isaiah 53 as the Messiah suffering for sin and the apparent contradiction in His second advent, that Jesus will be the conquering and ruling King, the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6 and Isaiah 60:2-3)
