## **Exodus- the Basics**

- Author- likely Moses
- Time period- apx. 1400 BC
- Birth of the nation and how God formed the nation of Israel to play a special role in His plans for the world
- Main characters/events
  - Slaves in Egypt and God delivers- Freedom! (Chapters 1-18)
  - Moses
  - The Law is established (Chapters 19-24)
    - Mosaic Covenant
  - Tabernacle/Tent of Meeting, The Priesthood, Offerings and Feasts established (Chapters 25-40)
  - The Glory of the Lord



## **Moses Birth/ Childhood**

- A new King/Pharaoh did not know Joseph
- Midwives Shiphrah and Puah, were told to kill the baby boys (throw them into the Nile), but let the girls live
  - BUT, the Midwives feared God and gave them a family of their own!
- Moses was hidden x 3 months, then placed in a papyrus basket, coated with tar and pitch (an Ark- saved in water)



- Sister, Miriam watched while Pharaoh's daughter took him, then offered to have him nursed by his own mother!
- Name Moses means "I drew him out of the water"

# Moses Overview






- Saved from genocide as a baby
- Tribe of Levi (Dad and Mom)
- Killed Egyptian who was beating a Hebrew slave
- Ran for his life to Midian (met Jethro, the priest) and marries wife #1, Zipporah
  - Had 2 sons, Gershom and Eliezer
- The Burning Bush
  - The Angel of the Lord
  - God tells him to go back and SAVE the Jewish people!
  - "I am that I am"
  - Please send someone else!!
- I'm not eloquent. I am slow of speech and tongue.
- God was going to kill him! Ex. 4:24-26
- Reunited with biological brother, Aaron and sister Miriam

# Pharaoh and the Plagues

- Aaron speaks as a prophet
- Pharaoh's heart



- Death of firstborn- The Passover- Blood of a Lamb
  - Blood on the outside of the home/ door
  - Would protect anyone inside the home
  - Saved from death/freedom the "outgoing"
  - Ex 12: 14

## The Exodus-Part 1

- Ex 13:21-22 By day the LORD went ahead of them in a <u>pillar of cloud</u> to guide them on their way and by night in <u>a pillar of fire</u> to give them light, so that they could travel by day or night. Neither the pillar of cloud by day nor the pillar of fire by night left its place in front of the people.
- Ex 14:19-20 Then the <u>angel of God</u>, who had been traveling in front of Israel's army, withdrew and went behind them. The <u>pillar of cloud</u> also moved from in front and stood behind them, coming between the armies of Egypt and Israel. Throughout the night the cloud brought darkness to the one side and light to the other side; so neither went near the other all night long.
- The Red Sea is parted!
- Within the next 3 days, they have bitter water and the people begin to grumble against Moses!
- The Lord who heals you = Jehovah Raphe
- Manna and quail are miraculously provided- and the Sabbath is recognized
- Water from a rock and Joshua leads the fight against the Amalakites- they win as long as Aaron and Hur hold up Moses' hands
- The Lord our Banner (Victory) = Jehovah Nissi


## **Exodus-Part 2**

# 10 COMMANDMENTS (GIVEN CMT. SINAI) 1 NO OTHER GODS 2 DON'T MURDER 3 DON'T COMMIT ADULTERY 4 HONOR THE SABBATH 5 HONOR PARENTS 10 DON'T COVET LJEALOUSY)

- Ex 20:21 The people remained at a distance, while Moses approached the thick darkness where God
  was.
- Laws were given: Bondservants, personal injuries, property, social responsibility, justice and mercy,
   Sabbath laws
- Ex 23:25-33 ..... Worship the LORD your God, and his blessing will be on your food and water. I will take away sickness from among you, and none will miscarry or be barren in your land. I will give you a full life span. "I will send my terror ahead of you and throw into confusion every nation you encounter. I will make all your enemies turn their backs and run. I will send the hornet ahead of you to drive the Hivites, Canaanites and Hittites out of your way. But I will not drive them out in a single year, because the land would become desolate and the wild animals too numerous for you. Little by little I will drive them out before you, until you have increased enough to take possession of the land. "I will establish your borders from the Red Sea to the Mediterranean Sea, and from the desert to the Euphrates River. I will give into your hands the people who live in the land, and you will drive them out before you. Do not make a covenant with them or with their gods. Do not let them live in your land or they will cause you to sin against me, because the worship of their gods will certainly be a snare to you."

## **Tabernacle and the Priestly Garments**

- Exodus 24: 9-11 <sup>9</sup> Moses and Aaron, Nadab and Abihu, and the seventy elders of Israel went up <sup>10</sup> and saw the God of Israel. Under his feet was something like a pavement made of lapis lazuli (sapphire), as bright blue as the sky.
- Ex 25-30: Instructions are given for the Tabernacle and the Priestly Garments
- Ex 31:12-17 The Sabbaths
- Ex 32:31-32 The Golden Calf / Moses' Intercession for the people
  - So Moses went back to the LORD and said, "Oh, what a great sin these people have committed!
     They have made themselves gods of gold. But now, please forgive their sin—but if not, then blot me out of the book you have written."
- Ex 33: The Tent of Meeting and later Moses and the Glory of God
- Exodus 34:29 <sup>29</sup> When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD.
- Ex 34-39 Building the Tabernacle and the Priestly Garments

- Ex 40: 34-38 Then the cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle. Moses could not enter the tent of meeting because the cloud had settled on it, and the glory of the LORD filled the tabernacle. In all the travels of the Israelites, whenever the cloud lifted from above the tabernacle, they would set out; but if the cloud did not lift, they did not set out—until the day it lifted. So the cloud of the LORD was over the tabernacle by day, and fire was in the cloud by night, in the sight of all the Israelites during all their travels.

  - Brazen Alter (blood sacrifice)
  - Table of Shewbread (I am the Bread of Life)
  - The Lampstand (it is the only source of light in the Tabernacle).... I am the Light of the World
  - Alter of Incense (Holy Spirit)
  - The heavy veil that separates the Holy Place from the Holy of Holiesis what is TORN when Jesus is crucified!
  - Ark of the Covenant: the Tablets (the Word), Manna, and Aaron's budding staff

## Leviticus – a continuation of Exodus











- Author- likely Moses
- The main topic = Holiness
- Main characters/ events
  - Moses, Aaron, Nadab, Abihu
  - Chapters 1-7: Sacrifice and offerings
  - Chapters 8-10: Priesthood/ High Priest (tribe of LEVI-ticus)
  - Chapters 11-15: Procedures for unclean things
  - Chapter 16: Day of Atonement
  - Chapters 17-27: Laws for living a holy life, Jewish calendar and feasts
  - Sabbath year of rest and the Year of Jubilee!
- The word "Holy" is found more times in this book, than any other!

- Voluntary- Burnt Offering- a male without defect- for God
- Voluntary- Grain Offering- finest flour and without yeast- for God
- Voluntary- Fellowship (Peace) Offering- a male or female without defect- for God
- Required- Sin Offering- a bull without defect- for US
- Required- Guilt (Trespass) Offering- for US

# The High Priest/ Garments- Chapters 8-10

- Head covering- Turban
  - Plate: Holy to the Lord
  - People's guilt on his head
- Shoulder pieces
  - Engraved w names of sons of Israel
- Urim and the Thummim
  - Within the breast piece, next to his heart
  - Bearing the people's judgement
  - Making decisions
- Breastplate w 12 Stones (Tribes)
  - Very specific order
  - Carry the tribes on his heart into the Holy Place for remembrance before the Lord
- Sash
  - Embroidered with needlework
- Hem: Bells & Pomegranates
- White garment- Ephod- 1 piece
- Blue Robe (coat)

### THE HIGH PRIEST'S GARMENTS EXODUS 28 By Mark Barry © 2007 AFES www.afes.org.au Please do not republish without permission, but feel free to copy for personal use.

TURBAN of fine linen above a golden plate, JUDGEMENT - a square engraved with the words of fabric made of linen "Holy to the Lord" in gold, blue, purple The engraved plate and scarlet yarns, and symbolised the bearing doubled over. The piece was held in place with cords of gold, attached to golden rings. Set in the breastplate were four rows of three stones set in gold, each engraved with the name of one of the twelve tribes. [15-29 two onyx stones in gold settings, engraved with the names of the sons of Israel for rememberance". [9-12] 12 STONES were each engraved with the name of one of the twelve URIM & THUMMIM - Held 1) sardius, topaz, & within the breastpiece carbuncle next to the high priest's 2) emerald, sapphire, & heart, symbolising the diamond bearing of the people's 3) jacinth, agate, & judgement before the Lord. These were 4) beryl, onyx, & jasper probably used for making decisions on particular The high priest would matters, [30] carry the names of the tribes on his heart into the Holy Place for remembrance before the Lord", [17-20] SASH embroidered with needlework. [39] UNDERGARMENTS made from linen, covering the EPHOD - a linen garment naked flesh" from the made of gold, blue, nips to the thighs, so the purple and scarlet high priest doesn't bear guilt in the Holy Place varns, held by a wover waistband. ## Nadab and Abihu

- Lev 10: 1-2
  - Aaron's sons Nadab and Abihu took their censers, put fire in them and added incense; and they offered unauthorized (strange) fire before the LORD, contrary to his command. <sup>2</sup> So fire came out from the presence of the LORD and consumed them, and they died before the LORD.

#### WHY did this happen?


- They had personally been selected by God to come before Him and worship from a distance Ex. 24:1
- They were among the first men during the Exodus to have fellowship with the Lord. They ate before Him and were allowed to witness His glory <u>Ex. 24:9-11</u>
- They had just undergone a meticulous 7-day cleansing/ consecration ceremony that assured they
  would be presented as holy before the Lord and fit for service in the Tabernacle <a href="Lev. 8"><u>Lev. 8</u></a>
- Aaron's offering was accepted, then this offering was "strange" and not according to God's direction Lev 3
- Nadab and Abihu received this honor because God selected Aaron and his sons to serve as priests on behalf of the people (<u>Ex. 28:1</u>). The Levitical priests—as servants of the Lord—facilitated the animal sacrifices and acted on behalf of the people in order to keep them in right relationship with the Lord according to the conditions of the Old Covenant.

What should we learn?
God is Holy
Obedience
God corrects His people
Don't take sin lightly

- Spring- 1<sup>st</sup> month- Nisan
  - Passover (Pesach)
  - Feast of Unleavened Bread
  - Feast of First Fruits
  - Feast of Weeks (Shavuot/ Pentecost)
- Interval of 3 months, current church age?
- Fall- 7<sup>th</sup> month- Tishri
  - Feast of Trumpets (Rosh HaShanah)
  - Day of Atonement (Yom Kippur)
  - Feast of Tabernacles (Sukkot)

# The Sabbath- What does this Represent?

- Sabbath DAY: God rested on the 7<sup>th</sup> Day
- Sabbath YEAR: Lev. 25
- The Year of Jubilee! (Shofar) Lev 25:8-54
  - During the Day of Atonement, the ram's horn (shofar) was blown to indicate the start of the year of Jubilee. The Israelites would dedicate this year of rest to God, acknowledging that God would provide for their needs.
  - Year of Jubilee comes every 50 years (after 7 cycles of 7 years)
  - Dedicated to rest!

# Sabbath Today?
