Grace to you and Peace!

On behalf of the elders, the deacons, and all the saints: Welcome to First Presbyterian Church of Bad Axe. We are glad that you are with us today to worship our Triune God. This bulletin contains a liturgy which will guide you through our worship service and material for the rest of your day. Please join us after the service for fellowship and snacks. Here's a bit of info about who we are and what we believe:

We are a <u>Christian Church</u>. This means we believe in the Holy Trinity – One God, in three persons: the eternal Father, the eternally-begotten Son, and the eternally-proceeding Holy Spirit – thus, we confess the ancient creeds of the Christian Church: The Apostles' Creed, the Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed, the Definition of Chalcedon, and the Athanasian Creed.

We are a <u>Protestant Church</u>. Although Protestants trace their beliefs and practices to the Apostolic Church, we also have historical roots in the Protestant Reformation of the 16th and 17th centuries. As Protestants, we believe that salvation is by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, for the glory of God alone, as revealed in Scripture alone. (Eph. 2:8–10)

We are a **Reformed Church**. Reformed Churches believe in the doctrinal summaries of the Holy Scriptures that come from the Protestant Reformation. For us, that means we confess the Westminster Standards, written at the Westminster Assembly in the 1640's. Thus, our beliefs do not change from year-to-year depending on who our pastor is, but our beliefs about what the Holy Scriptures teach have not changed for nearly 400 years.

We are a <u>Presbyterian Church</u>. Presbyterians believe that the biblical, and thus, God-ordained way of governing his Church is through elected and ordained elders (or, "presbyters"). Our elders shepherd the flock of God, protect the Church from false doctrine, and make decisions on her behalf. We also have deacons who take care of the physical needs of the flock of God.

Presbyterian Churches hold the public worship of God and the communion of the saints in high regard. Thus, the **Lord's Day Worship Service** is the most important event of the week. It is during this time that we gather together to hear the Word of God, pray, praise, and receive the Sacrament of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Definition of Chalcedon

(451)

We, then, following the holy fathers,

who all with one consent, teach men to confess one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, the same perfect in Godhead and also perfect in manhood;

Truly God and truly man, of a rational soul and body: coessential with the Father according to the Godhead, and consubstantial with us according to the manhood, in all things like unto us, without sin:

Begotten of the Father before the ages regarding the Godhead, and in these latter days, for us and for our salvation, born of the Virgin Mary, the God-bearer, regarding the manhood;

One and the same Christ, Son, Lord, Only-begotten, to be acknowledged in two natures, without confusion, without change, without division, without separation;

The distinction of natures, being in no way annulled by the union, but rather the property of each nature being preserved, and concurring in one person and one subsistence, not parted or divided into two persons, but one and the same Son, and only begotten, God the Word, the Lord Jesus Christ;

As the prophets from the beginning have declared concerning Him, and the Lord Jesus Christ Himself has taught us,
