Greetings & Welcome

We are pleased that you are here with us today to worship our Triune God. A typical Sunday morning service will last about 70 minutes. There is a nursery for nursing mothers where the service is televised. We also have mask-only sanctuary for those who want to remain in a more isolated environment.

This bulletin contains a **liturgy** (order of worship) which will guide you through our worship service. After the service, please join us for a time of fellowship, refreshments, and snacks in the lounge. Our Sunday school for all ages begins at 11:30 for anyone interested. Here is a little bit of information about who we are and what we believe:

We are a **Christian Church**. This means we believe in the doctrine of the Trinity – One God, in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – and we confess the ancient creeds of the Christian Church: The Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, the Definition of Chalcedon, and the Athanasian Creed.

We are a **Protestant Church**. This means that whereas we can trace our beliefs and practices back to the Apostolic Church, we also have historical roots in the Protestant Reformation of the 16th and 17th centuries. Because we are Protestants, we believe that salvation is by God's grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, for the glory of God alone, as revealed in Scripture alone. This doctrine of salvation is one of the essential beliefs of the Protestant Reformation.

We are a **Reformed Church**. This means we believe in the doctrinal summaries of the Holy Scriptures that come from the Protestant Reformation. For us, that means we believe in the Westminster Standards, written at the Westminster Assembly in the 1640's. Thus, our beliefs do not change from day-to-day or year-to-year depending on who our pastor is, but our beliefs about what the Holy Scriptures teach have not changed for nearly 400 years.

We are a **Presbyterian Church**. As Presbyterians, we believe that the biblical, and thus, Godordained way of governing his Church is through a polity of elders. Therefore, our elders are concerned with shepherding the flock of God, protecting the Church from false doctrine, and making spiritual decisions on her behalf. In addition to elders, Presbyterian churches also have deacons who take care of the physical needs of the flock of God.

As a Christian, Protestant, Reformed, and Presbyterian Church, we take the worship of God very seriously. **The Lord's Day Worship Service** is the most important event of the week for us. It is during this time that we gather together to hear the Word of God, pray, and receive the Sacrament of the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Prayerfully Consider

"Many would dismiss this and any other story, because they are convinced that the tale of Noah and his ark is mere mythology, and in fact, actually impossible...But is it impossible? It is not, as a little investigation shall show." (James Montgomery Boice)

"In modern measurements, the ark would have been around 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high, yielding a displacement of about 43,000 tons. The inside capacity would have been 1.4 million cubic feet, with an approximate total deck area." (T. D. Alexander)

"Given their hundred-year building, planning, and preparation time, Noah and his family could possibly have adapted and installed many labor-saving devices. Dumbwaiters, carts, chutes, rails, and simple plumbing may well have greatly streamlined their work as animal keepers." (C. John Collins)

"What about the 'millions and millions' of species? There is some difficulty in determining what is meant by the biblical word 'kind,' as in 'two of every kind'...If this corresponds to our modern classification of 'family,' the maximum number of families represented on the ark would be about seven hundred. But suppose the word actually corresponds to our word 'species'? In that case, the number would be much higher - but not beyond the ark's capacity." (James Montgomery Boice)

"A peculiar feature of the flood narrative is the number of detailed chronological notices. By pinpointing the exact date of the flood within Noah's life, the text underlines that it was a real event." (T. D. Alexander)

"The heavens existed long ago, and the earth was formed out of water and through water by the word of God, and that by means of these the world that then existed was deluged with water and perished. But by the same word the heavens and earth that now exist are stored up for fire, being kept until the day of judgment and destruction of the ungodly." (2 Peter 3:5b-7)

"[God] did not spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah, a herald of righteousness, with seven others, when he brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly." (2 Peter 2:5)

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

"Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'" (Matthew 28:18-20)

"Baptism is a Sacrament of the New Testament, wherein Christ hath ordained the washing with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, to be a sign and seal of ingrafting into himself, of remission of sins by his blood, and regeneration by his Spirit; of adoption, and resurrection unto everlasting life; and whereby the parties baptized are solemnly admitted into the visible Church, and enter into an open and professed engagement to be wholly and only the Lord's." (WLC 165)

"I will establish my covenant between me and you and your offspring after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you...And God said to Abraham, 'As for you, you shall keep my covenant, you and your offspring after you throughout their generations. The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper is one of the two sacraments of the New Covenant, given to us by our Lord Jesus, as a means of communicating his grace unto us. The bread and the wine are signs of the body and blood of Jesus Christ, and seals of the spiritual benefits thereof. It is a covenant meal thus, it is to be set apart by New Covenant ministers and received by the covenant community. These holy mysteries have been given to us by the Son of God, in order that we would be spiritually nourished; insofar as we are sanctified, preserved, have our faith fed, and our union with Christ confirmed, by the power of the Holy Spirit, and the person and work of Jesus Christ in his incarnation, life, and death. Rather than a re-playing of his death, this feast is a proclamation and remembrance of the death of Jesus on the Cross. Not only that, but participating in the bread and the cup is a participation in the body and blood of Christ. It is a communion with the Mystical Body of Christ; and thus, communion with the rest of his Church. In this meal, God speaks to our all of our senses, because it is the Gospel made visible. Invited to come up to the Lord's Table and partake in this Holy Supper, are communicant members and baptized members of other Bible-believing, Gospel-preaching, Protestant churches. If this does not describe you, please remain in your seat and meditate on the profound mystery and power of the Lord's Supper. Inquirers may speak with the elders if they are interested in partaking in this Holy Meal.
