He had to be he was in charge of all the nuclear arsenal and the Navy which the President Jimmy Carter had shared and this is written by Doris Kearns, a famous presidential bog. President Jimmy Carter had shared a powerful encounter he experienced as a young naval officer and events that he says powerfully shaped his life in order to be considered for an officer's position on a nuclear submarine. The candidate first had to personally be interviewed and approved by Admiral Hyman Rickover who at the time was the head of the United States Nuclear navy. Here's how President Carter describe the interview. Quote, I had applied for the nuclear submarine program. Admiral Rickover was the interviewer interviewing me for the job. It was the first time I'd ever met Admiral Rickover and we sat in a large room by ourselves for more than two hours. He let me choose any subjects I wanted to discuss with him carefully. I chose those which I felt I knew a lot about current events, seamanship, music, literature, naval tactics electronic Next, and gunnery, he began to ask me a series of questions of increasing difficulty. In each instance, he soon proved that he, I knew relatively little about the subjects I had chosen. He always looked right into my eyes. He never smiled. I was saturated with cold sweat. And finally he asked a question. I thought I could redeem myself. He said, How did you stand in your class at the Naval Academy? Since I had completed my sophomore year at Georgia Tech before Annapolis as a plebe, I'd done very well. And I swelled my chest with pride in the sensor. I stood 59th and a class of 820. I sat back to wait for the congratulations. Which never came. Instead, a question Did you do your best?

And it'll eventually get him across the finish line. My main goal in life is to cross the finish line with P Rocky, smokin hot Holly, my kids, my grandkids, I want to cross picking up speed. I don't want to crawl across it. The principle of the path is simply this. Everyone's on a path right now. Whether you realize it or not, you're on a path right now. Next Tuesday, Dawn, cold, rainy, but I promise so I drove there. When I finally walked into Carolyn's house and hugged and greeted my grandchildren. I said, forget the daffodils, this roads and visible clouds everywhere fog. There's nothing in the world. Except you and the kids that would have made me come here. I'm not going to drive another hand. But daughter smile calmly and said, well, we'll drive in this. We drive in this all the time. Well, you won't get me back on the road until it clears and I'm heading straight for home. Well, I was hoping you take me over to the garage though to pick up my car. How far will we have to drive? My daughter said not that far, just a few blocks. After several minutes, I had to ask, Where are we going? This is not the way to the garage. Mom we're going to the garage the long way. By way of the daffodils. Carolyn, I said sternly please turn this car around. It's all right mom. You'll never forgive yourself if you don't miss this experience if you miss this experience. After about 20 minutes, we turned into a small gravel road and I saw a small church and on the far side of that church I saw a hand lettered sign with an arrow that read Daffodil garden. We got out of the car. We took the kids hands. We followed Carolyn down the path and then we turned the corner to the past. I looked up and gas before me laid the most glorious sight. It looked as though someone had taken a great bath of gold and poured it on the mountain peak. All the surrounding slopes. The flowers were planted in logistics, whirling patterns, great ribbons, squats of deep bars white lemon yellow salmon pink, saffron, butter yellow Each different color variety was planted as a group so that it's swirled and flowed like its own river. There were five acres of flowers. But who's done this is Carolyn? Just one woman. She lives on the property that her home right there. She pointed to a little a frame house it was small and modest in the midst of all that glory. We walked in to the house. And on the patio we saw poster. answers to the questions. I know you're asking. The poster said the first answer was simple. 50,000 bolts 50,000. It read the second answer, one at a time by one woman with two hands, two feet and very little break. The third answer began in 1958. The Daffodil principle there it is. That moment was life changing. I thought of this woman who had never met more than 40 years before he began one bulb at a time to bring her vision of beauty and joy to an obscure mountaintop. Still just planning one bulb at a time year after year. It changed the world that she lived in. She had created something indescribable. Again, we'll pass on that word we know what that really means. Let's just say amazing, magnificent beauty. Inspiration. The principle of her Daffodil garden taught this one of the great principles. It's learning to move forward in our goals and our desires. One step at a time, one bulb at a time. Learning to love the doing learning to use the accumulation of time. When we multiply tiny pieces of time with small increments of daily effort, we to find we can accomplish magnificent things. The mother said this. As she departed she said it makes me sad in a way. I had to admit that Carolyn, what I might have accomplished. If I had a thought of a wonderful beautiful goal 35 years ago 40 years ago and had worked away at it one bulb at a time. All those years just think what I might have been able to achieve. My daughter summed up the message and looked at me and said start today mom. I proclaim Christ to you as men been in your face and love. I had coaches grabbed me by the face mask and say some things I'm glad my mom didn't hear. But we all still always say you know you're really in trouble when they stop talking to you.

I want you guys to start dreaming again for your last time you guys have lost a drink I want you to start dreaming. Get over this stuff like I have low self esteem. I don't know that God had fully accept me. What an insult. You have just made to God. Did I not tell you last night he made 2 trillion galaxies and then he Hunza hangs on across he gets spit on for you. What else would he have to do? That Almighty you could feel forgiven. Receive God's love. Believe God for who he is. Good lord. Get rid of all these bones and skeleton from your past. You can't control that. But what can you control the future? You can start today. just grateful I had a bitter guy tell me today what can I be grateful for my life sucks Are you glad you can see no comment joy has only one source and one source only a grateful heart. There you go. Did you know that that's it Secondly, you'll have a sense of worship if you have a grateful heart now I worship more Pete's retreats because the group's you guys always put the songs and keys that men can actually sing it Have you ever noticed when you're in church to get on the thing you have to Oh the men and women will be doing their thing you know and you see men doing that? Death was acceptable, but quitting was not. Literally. He said, what's the deal is that I gotta finish this up house to pay a rib. He said, You're an I'm your partner. I can't, I can't do without you said I'm in. We go out there. And we had tins, going on a little boombox. And I spilled a half gallon of paint up on the roof, but I'm thinking, Well, unless the helicopter comes over. I don't say I looked at him. I said, start out your mother or this guy needs to know about that. Great example. You know, we finished it. We got the money and paid the rent and then the fourth started coming in again. years later, he came

home for Christmas break from college. I'd always wondered if he thought I was a failure. Because I ran out of money and couldn't pay the house rent. Really, it was haunted me a bit. We were riding around the beltway in Washington and he said, Hey, Dad, remember that time we went broke? We had paint that house and I thought, Oh, my Seamus is just floated right back at the welfare because this is when God turned it into my failure. One of my failures into gold. He's waiting to do it for you guys. If you just surrender, go limp. Just go limp in his arms. My son says to me pop remember that time. He said I've been sick and I've seen other friends of mine. Their dads have been out of a job in between jobs. They just sit on the computer, send it out electronic resume. Bitch complain, go negative. He said pop. We ran out of money. And that day, you were talking to your friend about paving the house. you humbled yourself. You were a star you have a college degree. Love these guys, you minister to you could run their companies. But God called you to be their minister. And you went out in front of everybody to pay in the house. Hey, there's nothing disgraceful about being a house payer. And he said death I just realized how much you love our family that you'd do anything to keep us going. And then he says to me You're my hero Good Lord. God can take your failures and new saints and just turn them into go stop fighting boys. Surrender let me say missus you'll have a sense of worship. If you have a grateful heart, three you'll have a sense of mission. Have you noticed it's always the people with grateful hearts to go I can donate to that. I can help with that. What's good, what's bad. Bitterness blinds people. If you are bitterness long enough. There's a verse in Hebrews that says don't fall short of the grace of God. Let each of you pursue bitterness about pursue peace. Less the root of bitterness sprang up in you and thereby many are defiled. When you become bitter, it'll ruin every relationship you have. When you become bitter and you don't correct it, you become toxic. And you will repel people. They'll see you on caller ID and they're not going to pick up, they'll see you come in, they're going to duck behind the water cooler. They're tired to hear in your crap. It's old news. Bitterness also does this. Now the medical community knows that when people are bitter, the first thing that happens to their bodies, is your immune system goes down. This is real. Mayo Clinic anywhere. You will be in and out of sickness and you will be in depression. When you are bitter, it creates stress, cortisol is released your emotional gas tank when your emotional gas tank is full, you're there. That fills your emotional gasping a grateful heart. When you're ungrateful heart, it's a form of chronic stress. my cardiologist just told me because I'm in the zipper club, had a quadruple bypass recently. He said Jerry, you can drink too much that's bad for you. You can eat too much that's bad for you. What's the other thing was bad for you?
