came back up to Birmingham, he worked executive in a steel company went out to the came out here to California, northern California and ran a Christian camp out there for a couple of years came down to in the mid 80s and came down to Southern California and we had a chance to live together with our families Rocky and Sally if you can imagine the you know, two nitros and glycerin living together. We all were living there together and Jerry had just trying to figure out what he's gonna do with his life and, and I was over at his house one day and some guys back in Washington DC we're trying to get him to come back there and work with the fellowship fellowship with the guys that put on the international prayer breakfast every year. And and they have an unbelievable worldwide ministry and not with just politicians, but with just power people in people of influence all over the world. 

And and he is said reported us that he is also seeing large numbers of Muslim young people coming to Jesus. Jesus Christ is on the march. The question is, are you willing? Are you willing? Despite limitations imposed by the Chinese government, it's estimated that there'll be 100 million new Christians in China worshiping and underground evangelical and Catholic churches at the current growth rate David Aikman says he's a he's also a brother, a journalist from Washington. In his book Jesus in Beijing, China and a few decades will become the largest Christian country in the world. And Korea where Christianity is already outnumbering the Buddha's. There are mega churches with more than 10,000 members, numerous mega churches, the Yodo Full Gospel Church report 750,000 Minister, members, the Catholic Church in the Philippines reports 60 million members and is projected to have 120 million by mid century. What distinguishes Christians in these country is that they immerse themselves in the world of the Bible. A century ago, less than 10% of Africa was Christian Today, nearly 50%. That's an increase from 10,000,019 100 to more than 350 million Christians. Today, Uganda alone has nearly 20 million Christians and is projected to have 50 million. By the middle century, some African congregations have grown so big that their churches are running out of space. While American preachers routinely implore their people to come every Sunday and fill the pews. Some African preachers asked their members to limit their attendance to every second or third Sunday to give others a chance to hear the message. Central and South America. They're witnessing the explosive growth of Pentecostalism. As David Martin shows in his study the tongues of fire. It's partly a shift within Christianity millions of South American Catholics have become evangelical Protestants. In Brazil, for example, there are now 50 million evangelical Protestants whereas a few decades ago, there weren't enough to count. He insisted that through the grace of God he had performed innumerable healings and one of the assistant pastors in Virginia took him a bit doubtfully. He pointed the Bible and said young man There's a big difference between you and me. You see this book right here? We believe it. This world of Christianity this third world Christianity, it's coming our way to the United States. South Korea is now the second largest source of Christian missionaries in the world. South Korea has 12,000 missionaries all over the world preaching the gospel. Only in the United only the United States currently sins more, but it's waning. Last year is the first year more young men, more men left the ministry than entered the ministry last year. At one time, Christian missionaries went to the far countries of Africa and Asia where white priests and ropes proclaimed the Bible to wide eyes, uncomprehending brown and black people. In the future, you will see black and brown missionaries proclaim the Bible to wide eyed uncomprehending white people in the West. We might think this preaching will fall on. We hope this preaching does not fall on unreceptive ears. Well, that's what's going on around the world. Jesus Christ and Christianity is exploding. What about here in the United States, in one generation America has experienced a dramatic transformation. From a producing to a consuming society consumerism has had a powerful, transforming effect not merely on our spending habits based on our beliefs, and our values. Consumerism has changed the way our faith looks, believe it or not. Listen to this next quote. We have to we've come to see money as the key to pleasure and pleasure is the key to happiness. This definition of happiness has become the summum bonum. The ultimate American virtue, As one writer put it, quote, If you're not chasing money, what are you chasing? Happiness is the new bottom line. This belief is so much a part of the American culture that even people who should know better get confused. According to a recent study, over a half of the evangelical Christians agree with this statement. Half of the evangelical Christians agree with this statement, quote, the purpose of life is enjoyment and personal, full of quote. You know, this is what psychologists call the empty self. Bruce Larsen, who writes devotionals wrote a few paragraphs about his boyhood in Chicago. He said when I was a small boy, I attended a church every Sunday in a big Gothic Presbyterian Church. Those are the guys I came all the way out here to see if there was anybody like that. I believe Jesus Christ is goes around this world going does anybody believe in me? Frank Loesch was authentic. Aren't people just dying to get around somebody who is for real? And authentic? Aren't people just weary and tired of all this? fakie crap. Specially in the name of Jesus? It makes you puke, doesn't it boys? I'm not trying to put anybody down. I'm just voting. I'm voting. I'm not confused. About who I'm following John Stott, Billy Graham said was the greatest clergyman in the world. Just retired last year. Have you heard of John Stott? Giving his last major address before retiring. Michael Spencer wrote this March 10 2009. Now Michael is a journalist and he is himself and evangelical. Our group didn't agree with everything Michael said. But we thought most of this stuff sounds just about right. He says this, within two generations, evangelicalism will be a house deserted by half his occupants. And 10 to 20 years half the people that say they're evangelicals are going to quit. Now, let me just tell you what an evangelical is real simply because a lot of people are confused about that people don't like that word, because all the slick alligator shoe salesmen on TV, have given it a bad name. But an evangelical a bibble Biblical sense is a person that has Jesus Christ in his heart. He's rolling his dice on Jesus, he's putting his faith to church of Jesus, and the person of Jesus is so important that other people need to hear this message. They need to hear about Christ. People need the Lord. That's what an evangelical is. It's not that complicated at the DNA level, is it? Well, I think there's going to be so much social pressure. You know what, through public relations, they made smoking a worst sin and abortion in our country. I guarantee and marketing there's a book called The 22 Immutable Laws of marketing. And one of the about the second immutable law is the law of perception is stronger than reality. But you get the perception of most American people, and they do have the perception that if you smoke, you're a worse person than that's worse than having an abortion. Hey, check, check this out, mark by word. There's gonna be tremendous social pressure in the days to come to make you ashamed and embarrassed and press you from even naming the name of Jesus. That's why we're here. Now we are. That's why you better get all in or all out. Because I'm telling you a half hearted, you're gonna get rolled like dice. You better pray for the fire. And you better start playing offense and stop playing defense with your faith. And I don't mean an angry militant. I mean, a guy full of the love of Christ, Jesus Christ was the most powerful person that ever lived. He never went after power, he went after love. And in the end, guess what he got both. The collapse will herald the arrival of the anti Christian chapter of post Christian United States and tolerance of Christianity will rise to levels many of us have not believed possible in our lifetimes. Public policy will become hostile towards evangelical Christianity, seeing it as the opponent of the common good. Millions of Evangelicals will quit. Christian media will be reduced if not eliminated, many Christian schools will go on rapid decline. And I'm convinced the grace and the mission of God and Jesus Christ will continue to the ends of the earth. We've already seen, it's not the work of Jesus, it's going to stop. It's a lot of this half hearted part time Christianity, that's going to go ahead and get shot through the head and put out of its misery. Jesus Christ told us it was going to happen this way. 2000 years ago, he said you're the salt of the earth. And if you lose your saltiness, what do you good for? To be trampled on. And that's what's about to happen boys. evangelicals have identified their movement with the culture war. With political conservatism. This will prove to be a costly mistake. Evangelicals will increasingly be seen as a threat to cultural progress, public leaders will consider evangelicals bad for America bad for education, bad for children and bad for society. The Evangelical investment in moral and social and political issues has depleted their resources and expose their weaknesses. The fact is that massive majorities of Evangelicals cannot articulate the gospel with any coherence whatsoever. We fell in the trap of believing in a cause more than believing in a faith evangelicals have failed to pass on to our young people the Orthodox form of faith that can

take root and survive and a secular onslaught. Ironically, billions of dollars have been spent on youth ministers, Christian music publishing and media has produced a culture of young Christians who know next to nothing about their faith except how they feel about. Our young people have deep beliefs about the culture war, but don't know why they should obey Scripture. They don't know essential theology. They don't experience they don't experience spiritual discipline, our community, the coming generations of Christians are going to be monumentally ignorant and unprepared for culture wide pressures. There are only three kinds of churches, consumer driven mega churches, dying churches and new churches. Now let me just discipleship has been lost from our culture and Christ in our country. Now churches that want to share the gospel and reach out, they call themselves seeker friendly churches. Churches want to try to disciple people call themselves teaching churches, you know, the problem was that Jesus said, Go into all the world and make disciples in the first century. If you want to know what he's talking about, what do you have to go back to to figure that out? The first century? What did a first century disciple look like? I'm about to tell you. They never would have thought to separate evangelism and discipleship. That wasn't even a concept. Your coming to Christ should be so profound that you're going to Christ is for Christ is a big deal. If you don't have a lot of going for Christ in your life, you're coming to Christ probably didn't mean a doggone thing to you. They never said, What is the scripture say? They only would say this, what does it mean? Now from the age of five to 12, here's what a first

century disciple would look like. This is what Jesus was talking about. from five to 12, they began to memorize the Pentateuch. That's the first five books of the Bible. Now, did they memorize all of it are major portions of it? I don't really know. But they sure memorized a lot of it for seven years. You know, when Jesus was baptized, we've all heard if you've been in church, he went out to the desert and he was tempted by the devil three times are most of you kind of familiar with that. That was the Garden of Eden round two. Seriously, in the Garden of Eden, they were attempted, they failed. This was round two, and Jesus had to pass this. Now on the sermons you always hear, he was tempted three times and do you know how the Lord defeated the devil? And the preachers always say, by quoting what the Word of God so you knew that he was quoting from Deuteronomy and has your working knowledge of Deuteronomy. Now, let me tell you, I saw some guys. They were prisoners of wars in Vietnam, and they were interviewed. When they got released, they survived the war was over. The reporter said, What kept you go and said our chapel service? Would they give you a Bible? No. Well, had you have wealth between us, we pretty much reconstructed the book of Matthew. Now when that soldier said that it completely convicted me, this was a while back, I thought, now if I was abandoned brother in that prison with those men, what would my contribution had been? To reconstruct in a book so we could have a chapel service together? Not much. Now this summer, all my men, I gave him the summer challenge. I said, take the summer challenge boys. become a disciple. Why am I talking to you about disciple? You see, the way it's going? I don't even really need to read the rest of the article. You kind of get the drift, right. Get it? I told you how to get it and read it. But you better come a disciple, ask for fire and then come and disciple. If you want to succeed in business or sports or any endeavor in this world, you need a couple of things. You need some ability. You need some motivation and you need product knowledge. You know, the word disciple comes from the word discipline, and in yours over 30 years of counseling, man, I have come to the conclusion. Men don't have discipline problems. They have motivational problems, because you know what? When a guy gets motivated, guess what? He gets automatically discipline. He'll do it. When he really gets motivated and catches fire. He'll We'll do it. Now, I the summer challenge. Those boys memorize the Pentateuch, all my men, we don't do verses, we do blocks of Scripture so we can make a contribution for in prison, not planning on it. But you never know. But it's not the point. The scriptures are narratives, they spill over one story to the next. And if you just memorize verses, you'll get most of them out of context, or they won't have the pop, because they're all part of a story. So this summer, we're memorizing mostly Matthew chapter six, and Romans eight, the summer challenge then in September, we'll just see who who's who. I used to have kids that report for summer camps that coach I'm gonna start for this team. I said, Oh, yeah, we'll find out son. You show up August 14th. And I'll take a look at you for about a week now tell you if you want to play for this team, because we're gonna see who loves it. We're gonna see who loves it. Anybody can talk. I tell you, if you want to start the for your first stage of being a first disciple, first century disciple, commit yourself to memorizing God's word. The first verse I ever memorized in God's word was Matthew four, four. Does anybody know what it is? Matthew four, four. That's right, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. That's one of the verses Jesus quoted back to Satan when he was tempted. That's how you live every word from the mouth of God. I quote Jesus, I say the name of Jesus, I quote Scripture. It's powerful. It's alive. How can you be a man of God's word if you want to go around saying man of God? That's the second thing I'd ask you. I'm not mocking you. I'm just looking at your jaw jaw and cheek to cheek and say you can go around saying that fellas but if you don't know if you if you're afraid of death, you know man of God. And you can't be a man of God if you don't know God's word. You don't even know the stinking playbook. Can you imagine a football team going out there and the first game of the year and they never went over any plays? Well, maybe you can some teams but you see what happens to don't you commit yourself to fire no matter what it costs you I told you this morning a priority is something you'll pay for or you'll suffer for. Now. If there's nothing in your life that will pay for suffer for that let me correct you. You're not a man of God. You're not anything. There again, you say Aren't you afraid of offending us when you say no? Because if you're not anything, what are you going to do to me? Nothing? Nothing. Yang? I'll do nothing. I fear the man who has fire I know who I know who to fear. You have to have fire. Commit yourself to memorizing God's word become a Jedi Knight for Christ. Why wouldn't you? Sleep walk all through life and then your debt. Are you kidding me? That's all you want. Man, I'm calling you to be all Americans. I didn't come out here to start some damn JV football team. Don't worry about these boys. They hear worse than that in school. Your men tonight fellas. The second stage for a first century disciple age five to 12. They memorize scripture from 12 to 14 they read the wisdom of the sages. Pete and I had a mentor Dr. Barker that did this. We read about CTE stuff. We read about Hudson Taylor. We read about all the great missionaries. Jim Elliot, who was killed by the AKI we read all the wisdom of the sages. They became like brothers to us. And then the third stage of a first century disciple is this. This was optional, you would be observed. And if you were counted, deemed worthy, you had the fire. You'd pay for it, you'd suffer for it. Then you got to enter the third stage. And that would be one of the happiest days of your life. When a rabbi would walk up to you and son, I want you to walk with me. The third stage was walking with a rabbi. But I go into battle with you honest to god, I'm not kidding. I don't want to go into battle with you. I love you and be your friend. But I don't want to go into battle with all this stuff. My country is country still means something to me. I want to be part of the remnant. I want to be one of the guys that parachutes in here's the with the about the alternative. Now, I mentioned this morning, this lady that knows all these languages, and I started talking about this and she, she taught me the difference in Aramaic between the word lost in the word perish. Mathematically, you're still alive. But once you've perished, that's eternal. It's over. And this word, parish means this. This is the word Jesus used. It means solitary isolation in increasing continual multiplying abundant aloneness forever. Maybe what scientists call a black hole, the opposite of expanding life. It's eternal, imploding, perishing. Let's see what one scientist said about black holes. Quote, a black hole represents the ultimate triumph of gravity in its role as the regulator of a stars lifecycle. when a massive star dies, gravity becomes so strong that the star can't possibly hold itself up. What happens next? We don't know for certain one possible into a massive stars life is total collapse. It's tombstones a black hole and outside you can still feel the gravity from the hole. But you can't see it because gravity prevents light, from escaping from the stars surface black holes contain the strongest gravitational forces known in the universe. Nothing escaped from a black hole, not even light. That's why they call it a black hole. Black holes may form when stars are so overwhelmed by the force of their own weight, they collapse on themselves. are you connecting the dots here? a collapsing star shrinks. And if the core is massive enough, it keeps shrinking to the surface keeps collapsing until the entire star is shrunk to a point. Any light trying to escape outside the world is sucked back into a central point. No one and when she read this, this literally scared the hell out of me. And I mean, this literally, not cursing. No one communicates in you communicate out with no one and you have your memories. I mean this when she said it, I thought this is hell. I don't have the pastor's name on it. But maybe some of the pastors here will know he used to be the pastor of the Moody Bible Church. And these old time pastors. They weren't just pastors. They were no it's not Warren. I study his stuff. It's another one. I don't know. I don't know. Well, we will get it but I have all my men read this one minute after you die. And it's all the teachings about Kahina Shoal. Heaven, Hell, angels. It's all the biblical teachings. What happens to people when they die? So much confusion about this? I find this to be life changing. I know my destination is

one of the reasons I have so little fear. It's one of the reasons I have so much joy that I'm not going to have to be by my stinking self and darkness forever with my memories. I have some memories. I still wish I could forget it. When Dell fashion field was battling a rare brain tumor, the doctors assured him in April that he would be dead before Christmas. When I interviewed him, he told me that he wanted to follow God so fully that while he still had strength that when weakness came he would be able to endure his suffering with confidence. When you come home at night, you can manage to get around your house in the darkness because you've been there so often in the light you know, my best girlfriend back home he was my lieutenant and a large men's Bible study that I teach is dying from cancer. Bill gobble asked me the other day you're playing a lot of golf I said nonsense Mark got sick. We used to call mark the golf bishop. He loved getting the tee times and putting the groups together I'm the kind of guy just call me and tell me where to show up. I don't want to organize. Plus I can organize a two car funeral anyway it's funny since Mark got sick and he's so weak he can't play anymore. We just kind of don't play much anymore. I'm going through this book with him I'm doing life with Mark I'm gonna go with him all the way to the finish line. It's a least I can do. When Dale died November that year, those who were with him report
