Review of Action Items




Net income vs expenses for month of January is -\$17,813 (Includes outreach due for January)




Year to date income vs expenses as of January 31st, 2024 is







Silverdale Lutheran assets as of January 31st, 2024 are \$385,095











SLC CAMERA POLICY

- **1. Purpose**: Establishes Silverdale Lutheran Church guidelines for use of security cameras and remote monitoring systems in SLC buildings in a way that enhances security while respecting the privacy expectations of employees, members, volunteers and visitors.
- **2. Scope**: This policy covers all employees and staff, including volunteers.

3. Definitions:

- a. Video Camera recordings: SLC has 24 cameras installed (internal/external). These types of cameras have the ability to record images in a given area. Images may be digital or recorded footage. These cameras are not equipped with audio [or listening capabilities] and are passive cameras only.
- **4. Policy**: Silverdale Lutheran Church is committed to protecting the church's property and its buildings and maintaining work spaces that are safe and secure for both staff and visitors. Cameras are not actively monitored 24/7 but are recording continuously. Camera footages can be played back when needed or supplied to law enforcement as part of an investigation.

5. Access to cameras and recordings:

- a. Recorded video will be secured, and viewing access granted based on the following:
 - i. Viewing of personnel in recorded video shall be limited to approved individuals with a need to know and those people who receive calls from the alarm monitoring center when an alarm is activated (Office Mgr, Maintenance Mgr, Property & Grounds Chair), with prior approval of the Office/Business Manager or Maintenance Manager.
 - ii. Access needed for things such as vandalism, stolen/missing items or other security related issues will be authorized by the Office Manager/Business Manager and/or Maintenance Manager.

6. Acceptable Camera Usage

- a. Placement of cameras shall only be considered for the security and safety of employees, staff and visitors. Cameras are installed in both outdoor and indoor locations, that are deemed public spaces, such as indoor hallways, entryways and large gathering spaces and outdoor parking spaces, walkways and playground areas. Cameras are not installed in spaces where individuals have a reasonable expectation of privacy such as restrooms and office spaces.
- b. Signs may be posted at the entrance to the church parking lot and other areas in and around the campus to inform others that security cameras are in use.
