Rite of Holy Baptism (11am)

Introduction

P: In baptism our gracious heavenly Father frees us from sin and death by joining us to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. We are born children of a fallen humanity; by water and the Holy Spirit we are reborn children of God and made members of the church, the body of Christ. Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God.

Presentation

Sponsor: I present Levi Nolan Patterson for Holy Baptism.

P: Eric and Emily, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Levi baptized into Christ?

Parents: We do.

Do you promise to care for him faithfully in every way as God gives you opportunity, that he may bear witness to the faith we profess, and that, living in the covenant of his baptism and in communion with the church, he may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ?



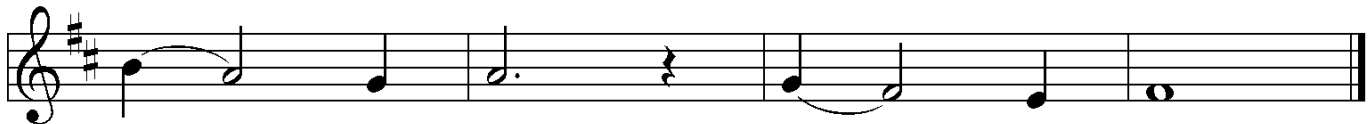
