Treasurer's Report

Lead Pastor Council Report August 14, 2023 Rev. Bill Crabtree

<u>Admin</u>

- 2 program staff meetings some of which included planning the startup of our program year and Rally Day. We are not calling it Rally Day this year (we all felt it is kind of tired) but substituting "Home Coming Sunday" and "Homecoming Weekend." It will include the Friday potluck and concert, special food drive, and Sunday worship with Sanctuary Choir, new organ, and start of Sunday School. Hoping to encourage some to re-engage with Sundays after not doing so after Covid.
- Did all the usual admin meetings: weekly staff, mutual ministry committee, and separate meetings with PJ/Justin, Kim, and Bruce. Also met regularly with Altar care leader, Jane Rhodes.
- Time to get the Nominating Committee up and running!
- Had a number of conversations/meetings regarding a new Small Group Connector – the position that has been vacant since COVID, that was approx. 10 hours a week and funded by the break the barrier fund. Will be meeting with VP about this.

Education

- Trying to get a new Foundations class started but may have to wait until September if we don't get more sign-ups. Taught all the usuals: Manna, Mandate, and Thursday Genesis study.
- Planning my Sunday class in the Fall planning on doing the Lord's Prayer requested by a number of folks.
- Supported VBS by playing guitar and leading some songs at both opening and closing each day of that week.

Worship

 Still working on liturgist training – creating a video/identifying new liturgists, etc.

- Check out report in drop box for attendance. Perhaps a slight uptick in inperson worship
- Worked with Justin on hymns and liturgy for the fall
- Christmas Eve falls this year on a Sunday so we are moving advent up a
 week so we can have Advent 4 the week before and have usual Christmas
 Eve worship on Sunday. What to do about the 11am service?

Pastoral Care

- Had two large memorials back in June and then now a couple of smaller ones.
- Hospital visits continue at about 2-3 a week.
- Kim is having a lot of phone conversations with people I assign to her to follow up on. Moreover, Kim and I are discussing her putting some of her hours to inactive member follow up.
- Quit a number of one-time pastoral care crisis visits

Churchwide Actions

I continue to have conversations about last year's ELCA Churchwide Assembly which among many other things, voted to form a commission to bring a recommendation to the 2025 CWA regarding adopting an entirely new constitution. It also will be voting on removing the bound conscience statement in the Human Sexuality Social Statement regarding those who still hold homosexuality to be sinful, etc. Although it will be status quo for a number of years, as Council members, you need to be "in the know" as much as possible. There are those who are very concerned about possible changes to the ELCA model constitution for congregations, especially in-regard to IF SLC ever decided to leave the ELCA, whether we could retain our property, etc.

Property & Grounds Report

Date: August 14,, 2023

Security Alarm Calls:

Status: I am getting Alarm Center calls for "Undefined zone code 00" so we are continuing to put that zone in TEST mode until the problem can be resolved. The expiration date for the current TEST mode is 10:18 AM, August 26th. We still have to use the Bypass key to bypass two zones. Fire Solutions NW is our contractor but really doesn't have expertise on Security Alarm Systems thus we are considering changing to another contractor.

Olympic Lutherhaven:

Olympic Lutherhaven has now been open as of May 27th and the water tests continue to pass. Vinland Lutheran is leading an effort to recoup the two lost RV spots by expanding the RV area east of the driveway. I replaced the bent Volleyball Court pole with a new pole back in early June. During All Church Camp I installed an Indirect Drain on the Deep Sink in the Lodge Kitchen and installed a hand washing sink in the Kitchen. There were also two underground water pipe leaks that were noticed during All Church Camp and John Thayer and I fixed both but the one behind the Girls' restroom requires further repair to be accomplished as Camp reservations permit.

Island Lake Cemetery:

Status: No significant change from last month. The normally open gates to the Cemetery continue to be locked due to past and more recent activity on site plus based on comments received from neighbors. The Exit drive gate is locked with a padlock and the Entrance drive gate is locked with a combination lock. A family that attended the Memorial Day Service has purchased additional lots after comparing our plot prices with another cemetery. One more lot was sold this past week.

Church Maintenance/Projects:

Mark Lund is back and has finished painting the Parking Lot stripes and is gradually repainting the cross walk areas. I have pressure washed the cracks in the Parking Lot pavement. Mark and Lisa have been gradually filling the cracks to prevent further damage and to extend the life of the pavement.

We have made a down payment to Advanced Door Services for installation of ADA openers on the main entrance and the two restroom doors at the Gathering Place. The ADA openers have been installed but Wire It Up has been too busy to install power so we now have two estimates to complete the power connections. I am still working on an estimate for installing ADA wheelchair ramps to the Gathering Place building from the Parking Lot.
