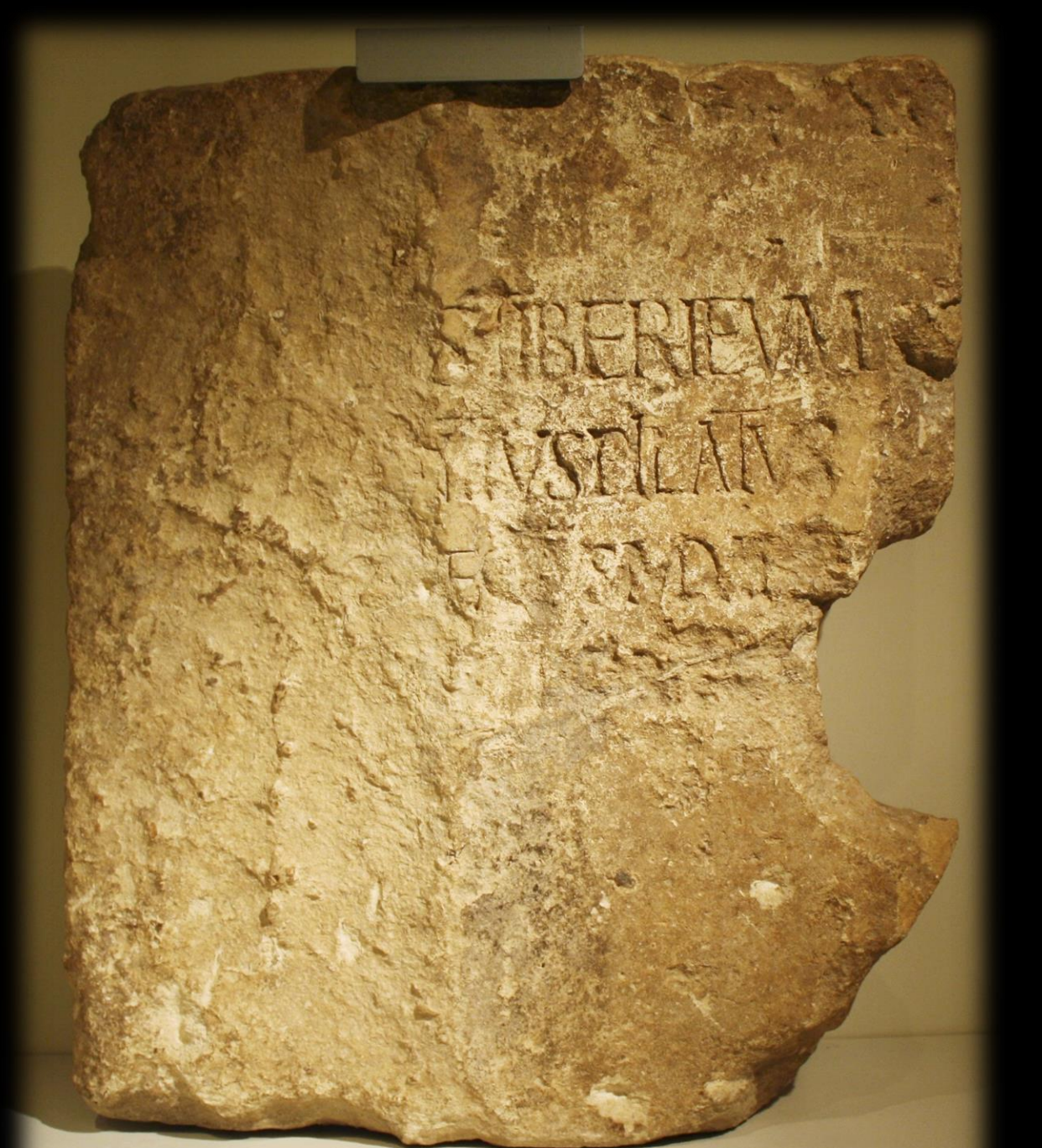
"Pontius Pilatus, the prefect of

Reference: The original inscription found in Caesarea
and during the excavations of the Herod. In an exhibit
at the Israel Museum in Jerusalem.

Pontius Pilatus was the Roman prefect
who presided over the trial of Jesus of
Nazareth (Matt. 27:11-26). The content
of the inscription and the use of the
Latin language hint at the level of
Romanization throughout the province,
and in Caesarea, at the beginning of
the 1st c. A.D.

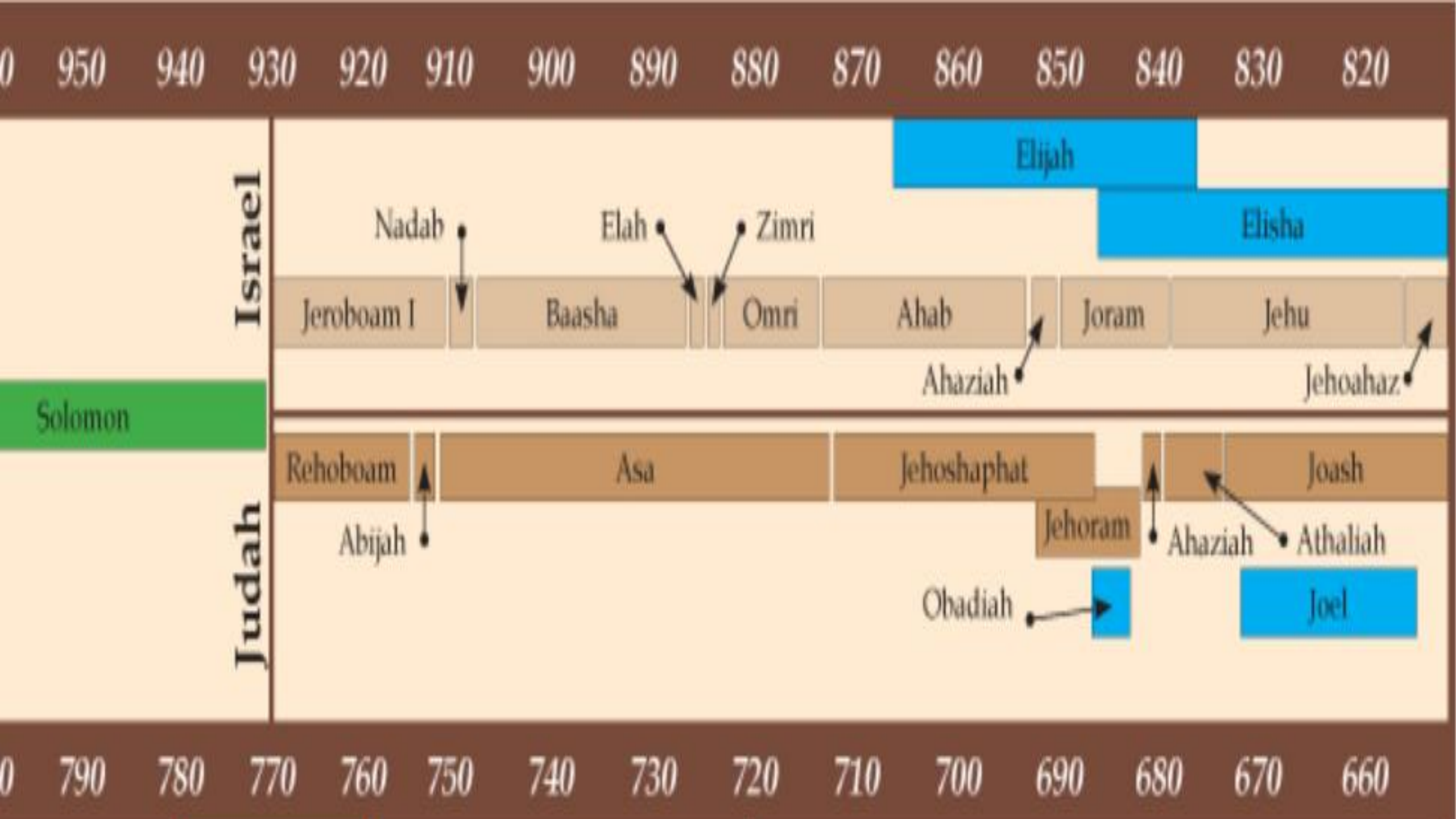


