

Dawn of The Church: Study Guide

The church we see today can look very different from the church we read about in the New Testament. Today when we think of churches we most often think of buildings, services, scandal, protests, and greed. One Barna study recently showed that when Millenials and younger were asked about the church the two most common responses were anti-gay and hypocrites. Yet when we open up scripture we see something dramatically different than all the inward division, hurt, and showmanship that we see in the church today. We see something real. We see something raw. We see the movement Jesus started. Starting this week, we are going to be looking through the first few chapters of Acts. There we'll see the dawn of the church. We'll see how God started the church and the direction he originally sent it in. Hopefully this will help us, as we ourselves navigate through the church was meant to be.

Read Acts 1:1-11

Action: What major points do you see in the text about the foundation of the church?

The Church was founded by Jesus and his work in the cross. Because he founded the church through his sacrifice, he then points the church in the direction they should go. In many churches, this is called the Great Commission. It is Jesus' last words here on earth encouraging the church towards his Goal and his purpose.

Read Acts 1:8

When you read this, what does Jesus say the mission of the church should be? What are some things that often get misunderstood as part of the church's mission in our culture today?



The Mission Jesus left us with was simple, make disciples. The direction is simple, but the execution is much harder. He encourages them that this work of making disciples must be done in both their home (Jerusalem), their neighboring community (Judea and Samaria) and to the entire world (ends of the earth.)
