



## Ulrich Zwingli

- January 1, 1484 – Zwingli born in the Swiss village of Wildhaus
- 1504 – B. A.
- 1506 – M.A. in 1506
- Priest in Glarus for 10 years

## The Swiss Confederation

## 1515 – 1522

### Zwingli and Erasmus

- 1516 – Zwingli leaves Glarus for Einsiedlen
- 1516 to 1518 – Zwingli is converted
- 1516 – the year Zwingli claims he began preaching the gospel (a year before Luther's 95 Theses)

### Zurich

- January 1, 1519 – Great Minster in Zurich
- 1519 – plague hits Zurich and Zwingli almost died

## 1522 – 1523

### Sausage and Marriage

- March 1522 – Lent sausage supper
- 1522 - he and 11 others signed the petition "Petition to Allow Priests to Marry, Or at Least to Wink at Their Marriage"
- Marries Anna Reinhart

### Disputations

- January 1523 – 67 Articles



- First and Second Disputation
- Zurich becomes Reformed

## 1524-1531

### The Break With Rome

- Easter Day 1525
  - No Mass celebrated
  - Plain bread on wooden plates and a jug of wine for the Lord's Supper
  - Service in German instead of Latin

### The Lord's Supper Controversy

- Luther and Zwingli reject transubstantiation
- Luther – consubstantiation
- Zwingli – memorial
- October 1529 – Marburg Colloquy

## Heinrich Bullinger

- July 18, 1504 – Bullinger born in a small town a few miles west of Zurich
- Age 12 – School of the Brethren of the Common Life



- 1519 – University of Cologne
- Converted at age 17
- 1523 to 1529 – primary instructor of the school at the Cistercian convent in Kappel

### **Bullinger Meets Zwingli**

- 1527 – Bullinger meets Zwingli
- 1528 – Bullinger became the part time pastor of the church as Hausen
- Reformer of Bremgarten
- 1529 – Bullinger marries Anna Adischwyler. They eventually had 11 children and also adopted other children. All six of Bullinger's sons became Protestant pastors.

### **Bullinger in Zurich**

- 1531 – flees to Zurich
- Age 27 – succeeds Zwingli as the chief minister. He held this position for 44 years until his death in 1575.

### **Bullinger the Theologian**

- 1536 – co-authored the First Helvetic Confession
- 1549 – Bullinger invites Calvin to Zurich to try to resolve disagreements over the Lord's Supper
- September 17, 1575 – Bullinger dies
