❖ Matthew 3:16—*And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him*

(1) The Spirit of wisdom and understanding.

(2) The Spirit of counsel and might

(3) The Spirit of Knowledge

(4) The Spirit of fear of the Lord

❖ Matthew 7:28—*And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, 29 for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.*

❖ John 17:4—*I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. 5 And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed*

❖ John 2:23—*But Jesus on his part did not entrust himself to them, because he knew all people 25 and needed no one to bear witness about man, for he himself knew what was in man.*

❖ John 4:34—*My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work.*

3. The Messiah's rule

❖ *Isaiah 11:3-5*

(1) The Messiah's joy would be in the Lord

(2) The Messiah would judge and rule with perfect righteousness

(3) The Messiah would be faithful to his people

❖ John 5:22-23—*The Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son, 23 that all may honor the Son, just as they honor the Father*

- ❖ 2 Corinthians 5:21—*For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God*

❖ *Isaiah 11:6-16*

A note on OT hermeneutics

❖ *Acts 2:14-21*

1. He will make peace among all of his people (6-7, 13-14)

2. He the effects of the Fall will be completely overturned (8-9a)

- ❖ Romans 8:19-22—*For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God. 20 For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope 21 that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. 22 For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now.*

3. He will build a global kingdom (9b-10)

4. He will gather his people from all over the globe (11-12)

5. The Lord will destroy anything that stands in the way of his people coming to him (15-16)

- ❖ Ephesians 2:17—*he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near*

- ❖ Revelation 21:5—*Behold, I am making all things new.*

- ❖ John 10:15-16—*I lay down my life for the sheep. 16 And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.*

- ❖ John 6:37-39—*All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. 38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me. 39 And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.*
