Wilderness Failure

Main Idea

Because of the Israelites' disobedience in the wilderness, God disciplined them. Their idolatry and disbelief were met with sickness, death, and exclusion from the promised land. God continues to discipline His sons and daughters as a loving Father.

Lesson Review

- How did Israel disobey God while Moses was on the mountain?
- A They made a golden calf and worshiped it instead of the true God.
- What did Israel do wrong when they reached the promised land?
- A They refused to trust God's promise and would not enter the land.
- How did God discipline His people for their sin?

Wilderness Failure

- A He sent judgment, sickness, and wandering, and kept that entire generation from entering the land.
- Why does God discipline His people?
- A Because He loves them and uses discipline to turn their hearts back to Him.
- Who interceded for Israel, pointing us to Jesus?
- Moses prayed for the people, showing us the greater intercession of Christ.

Catechism Connection - Baptist Catechism (1693)

- What special act of providence did God exercise toward man in the state wherein he was created?
- A God entered into a covenant of life with Adam upon condition of perfect obedience.
- Q Q13. Did our first parents continue in the state wherein they were created?
- A No. They fell by sinning against God.
- Q Q14. What is sin?
- A Sin is any want of conformity unto, or transgression of, the law of God
