

General Baptists

- 1609 John Smyth baptizes himself
- 1611 Thomas Helwys moves the church back to England
- 1626 six General Baptist churches

Particular Baptists

- Calvinistic particular or definite atonement
- 1641 Particular Baptist church that performed believer's baptism by immersion
- 1644 First London Confession
- 1677 Second London Confession
- 1689 Second London Confession officially published
- Hyper-Calvinism

Baptists in America

Philadelphia Association

- 1688 Elias Keach founds first Baptist church in Pennsylvania
- 1707 Philadelphia Association

Charleston Association

- 1682 Particular Baptist Church in Maine
- 1696 church moved to Charleston, South Carolina
- 1751 Charleston Association
- 1767 Charleston Confession of Faith

Sandy Creek Association (Separate Baptist)

• Great Awakening



- 1755 Sandy Creek, North Carolina
- 1758 Sandy Creek Association
- 1816 Articles of Faith

Southern Baptist Convention

Origin

- 1812 Adoniram Judson and Luther Rice
- 1814 General Missionary Convention (Triennial Convention)
- 1824 society formed for the distribution of literature
- 1832 home mission society formed
- 1844 Georgia missionary refused
- May 8, 1845 Southern Baptist Convention formed

Theology

- We believe in the fall of Adam and impartation of his head (sin) to all his posterity; in the total depravity of the human nature and man's inability to restore himself to the favor of God.
- We believe in the everlasting love of God to His people and the eternal unconditional election of a definite number of the human family to grace and glory.
- We believe that sinners are only justified in the sight of God by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ, which is unto all and upon all them that believe.
- We believe all those who were chose in Christ before the foundation of the world are in time effectually called, regenerated, converted, and sanctified and are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary

• 1826 – Furman College



- 1856 South Carolina Baptist Convention
- 1859 first classes meet
- 1877 seminary moved to Louisville, Kentucky
- Abstract of Principles
 - IV. Providence God from eternity, decrees or permits all things that come to pass, and perpetually upholds, directs and governs all creatures and all events; yet so as not in any wise to be the author or approver of sin nor to destroy the free will and responsibility of intelligent creatures.
 - V. Election Election is God's eternal choice of some persons unto everlasting life not because of foreseen merit in them, but of His mere mercy in Christ – in consequence of which choice they are called, justified and glorified.
