The Ten Commandments

Main Idea

The Mosaic covenant is a large step toward realizing God's promises to Abraham. After saving the Israelites from Egypt by grace, God gives them the law and covenant rituals to highlight sinfulness, secure civil order, and guide His people in good works.

Lesson Review

- Why did God give His people the law after saving them?
- A Because He had already rescued them by grace, and now He taught them how to live as His treasured people.
- Q Can anyone obey God's law perfectly?
- A No. God's law shows us our sin and our need for Christ.
- Why is it still good for Christians to follow the Ten Commandments?
- A They teach us what pleases God, how to love Him, and how to love our neighbor.

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- Which is the first commandment?
- A The first commandment is, Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- Which is the sixth commandment?
- A A. The sixth commandment is, Thou shalt not kill.

Family Devotion Questions

- What does the first commandment teach us about God's place in our lives?
- How might we "have no other gods" before Him this week?
- Why does loving God come before everything else?
- Which of the Ten Commandments is easiest for you to remember?
- Which is hardest to obey?
- How does knowing we can't obey perfectly point us to Jesus?
- A Because the law shows us our sin, it leads us to Jesus—the One who obeyed perfectly in our place and gives us grace when we fall short.
