- The primary difference between teaching and preaching is preaching calls for a response.

Kingdom of Heaven

- Matthew 5:1–12
- Verses 3-9 deal with the internal aspects of the kingdom and verses 10-12 deal with the external aspects of the kingdom.

Poor in spirit	Kingdom of Heaven
Those who mourn	They shall be comforted
The meek	They shall inherit the earth
Those who hunger and thirst for righteousness	They shall be satisfied
The merciful	They shall receive mercy
The pure in heart	They shall see God
The peacemakers	They shall be called sons of God

- Subjects of the kingdom are persecuted in this life, but that is part of the present kingdom of heaven.
- 1 Peter 2:18–23
- 1 John 2:15–17

Teaching Discourses

Teaching sections in Matthew

- Chapters 5-7 contain the Sermon on the Mount.
- Chapter 10 contains teaching for his disciples on what to expect as they proclaim the kingdom.
- Chapter 13 is filled with kingdom parables.



- Chapters 18-20 contains teaching on living together in the kingdom and the dangers from the world.
- Chapters 24-25, the Olivet Discourse, teaches about the overlap of this age and the age to come.
