

English Reformation

1408 - Constitutions of Oxford

1520 – Thomas Bilney organizes meetings at the White Horse Inn

1531 – Bilney burned at the stake

William Tyndale

- 1494 Tyndale born
- 1512 earned bachelor's degree
- 1515 earned master's degree
- 1521 tutored and pastored in his home town
- 1523 sought permission to translate the Bible into English
- 1524 left for Germany
- 1526 prints 6000 copies of the English New Testament
- 1528 The Parable of the Wicked Mammon
- 1536 Tyndale executed

King Henry VIII

- Age 17 married Catherine of Aragon
- 1534 Act of Supremacy
- Henry marries Anne Boleyn
- Beheads Anne Boleyn and marries Jane Seymour
- 1538 encourages the reading of the Bible
- 1543 prohibits Bible reading

King Edward VI

1547 – Edward becomes king

- Book of Common Prayer
- 1553 Edward dies

Lady Jane Grey

Bloody Mary

- Reverted England to Catholicism
- Hugh Latimer Bishop of Worchester
- Nicholas Ridley Bishop of London

Queen Elizabeth I

- Returns England to Protestantism
- New Act of Supremacy proclaiming Elizabeth the head of the Church of England
- 1559 new prayer book
- 1570 Pope excommunicates Elizabeth
- 1587 Mary, Queen of Scots executed
- 1603 Elizabeth dies

Scottish Reformation

- 1528 Patrick Hamilton burned for heresy
- 1542 James V dies, James Hamilton rules as regent

John Knox

- Went to Geneva during reign of Bloody Mary
- 1558 The First Blast of the Trumpet Against the Monstrous Regiment of Women
- 1559 Knox returns to Scotland

Catholic to Calvinist
