 - You can't look at the present body and know exactly what the resurrection body will look like.
 - There will be continuity between the present body and the resurrection body.
- Four contrasts between the present body and the resurrection body.
 - Our present bodies are perishable whereas our resurrection bodies will be imperishable.
 - Our present bodies are dishonorable whereas our resurrection bodies will be glorious.
 - Our present bodies are weak whereas our resurrection bodies will be powerful.
 - Our present body is a natural body whereas our resurrection body will be a spiritual body.
