



Introduction

We covered the offices of Christ in the previous lesson, now we will cover places and things that typify Christ and His passions.

Typical Places

Explicit

1. Hebrews 12-13:14, Jerusalem is the city of God's people, the new Jerusalem is the final kingdom of God's people
2. Revelation 18, Babylon is the evil, worldly desires in which we are willing slaves to. Those who have evil desires will weep over their sin, because they loved it so much.

Implicit

1. Exodus 13:14, Psalm 77:14-15, Romans 6:17-18, Egypt is the land of bondage in which God's people were redeemed from, Christ's people have been redeemed from sin and death in which they were in bondage.
2. Genesis 3:22, Revelation 21:1-3, Revelation 22:1-2, Eden was a place for the man of God, Adam, to dwell with his bride and God himself. The new Jerusalem will be in the place God dwells with his people and will be the dwelling place of the true man of God, Christ, and His bride. They will be able to then eat from the tree of life.
3. 1 Kings 6:11-13, Ephesians 2:22, The Temple that Solomon was commissioned to build was intended to be the dwelling place of God amongst his people where they could commune with Him, We are now the Temple of God where He dwells with us through the Holy Spirit and Christ being the cornerstone.

Typical Things

Notice the genre in which specific items are typified

Explicit

1. Numbers 21:9, John 3:14-15. Moses lifted up a serpent nailed to a pole that was lifted up and healed the Israelites. Christ is the better brazen serpent lifted up.
2. Exodus 16:15-19, John 6:32-33, 49-51, 58. God gave manna to the Israelites to consume to save them. Jesus is the true manna from heaven.
3. Exodus 26:33, Hebrews 10:20 The veil was made to separate God and the people. Jesus is the better curtain around the holy of holy that was torn to reconcile God and man.
4. Numbers 20:2-10, 1 Corinthians 10:1-5. Christ is the better rock that springs forth water. The Spirit is the living water.



Implicit

1. Hebrews 9:3-4, 2 Corinthians 1:20. The arc contains items of the promises of God. Jesus is the greater Arc of the Covenant. In Him are all the promises of God (B. Keach 1826)
2. Leviticus 24:5-9, John 6:35-40. The show bread was to show God's sustaining and enduring love for his people. Christ is the bread that will feed all of his people without end.
3. Genesis 6-7, Romans 5:17. The Arc withstood the wrath of God and protected those in it. Christ took the wrath of God and protects and reconciles those in Him.
4. Exodus 28:9-12, John 10:14-17. Two stones were engraved with the names of the 12 tribes as a remembrance for intercession. The two stones represent the dual nature of the church of God, jew and gentile and Christ intercedes for all of his people.
5. Numbers 17:1-12, 1 Corinthians 15:56-57. Aaron's staff was dead wood that was chosen, by a sign of life, to show victory over enemies. Christ was dead and given life as a chosen one that claimed victory over the enemies of God.
6. Exodus 15:22-26, John 7:38-39. Until a tree was immersed in bitterness, it could not be sweet and drinkable to give life to God's people. Christ took the bitter punishment of God on a tree and gave the Spirit for all of God's people to drink.
