- Magisterial Reformers Luther, Zwingli, and Calvin
- Radical Reformers reformers who had no support from the ruling authorities
- Anabaptists baptized adults that had previously been baptized as infants

German Radical Reformers

Wittenberg

Thomas Muentzer

- Muentzer became the priest at Zwickau
- One of the leaders of the German Peasants' War of 1524-1525
- May 1525 dies in the battle of Frankenhausen

Münster

- Jan Matthijs baker from Haarlem, Germany
- New Jerusalem is Münster, Germany
- Easter Sunday, 1535 Matthijs killed
- Jan van Leiden successor to Matthijs
- June 1535 gates opened allowing combined Catholic-Lutheran army into the city

Swiss Radical Reformers

- 1524 baptism crisis
- 1525 public debate about baptism
- Swiss Anabaptists known as the Swiss Brethren
- January 1527 Felix Mantz drowned in the river

Class 5: The Radical Reformers



- 1527 Schleitheim Confession
- Anabaptists were concerned first with holiness
- Most radicals rejected justification by faith alone because they believed it was a threat to holiness
- Hans Hut predicted Christ would return on Pentecost Sunday, 1528

Menno Simons

- 1496 born in the Netherlands
- Age 28 ordained a Catholic priest
- 1525 began having doubts about transubstantiation
- Doubts about infant baptism influenced by the death of Sicke Freerks
- 1535 finally breaks with Rome
- The Blasphemy of Jan van Leyden
- Mennonites

The Amish

- BASIN
 - o B Brotherhood of all believers refuting the hierarchy of Roman Catholicism
 - o A Adult (or believers') baptism refuting infant baptism
 - S Separation of church and state revealing a central tenet
 - I In the world, but not of it showing the belief in separation from worldliness
 - o N Nonviolent resistance stressing the view of pacifism
- Jacob Amman born mid 1600s
- Moved from Switzerland to Pennsylvania



Faustus Socinus

- Anabaptists
- Spiritualists
- Rationalists
 - o 1539 born in Siena, Italy
 - o Socinianism beginning of rational, moral, modern religion
