## Apparent injustice

Ecclesiastes 8:14-15

Injustice abounds here under the sun and complaining can't change that fact. What is best is for the believer to enjoy the simple graces and pleasures that God grants us while we live here under the sun.

- Solomon's reminds us of the limits of wisdom
  - Ecclesiastes 8:16-17
  - Ecclesiastes 9:1a

While wisdom can do so much for us here under the sun, it cannot do everything. It cannot undue the curse. It cannot answer every one of our questions.

### Death

- Ecclesiastes 9:1b-3
  - 1. God is sovereign (1b)

- 4. Man seems to deserve it though (3b)

#### Ecclesiastes 9:4-6

- 2. Its better to live (4-6)

#### Ecclesiastes 9:7-10

- 1. Eat and drink with gladness (7)
- 2. Live comfortable, enjoyable lives under the sun (8)
- 3. Enjoy the beloved that God gives you (9)
- 4. Enjoy the work you find, and work hard at it (10)
