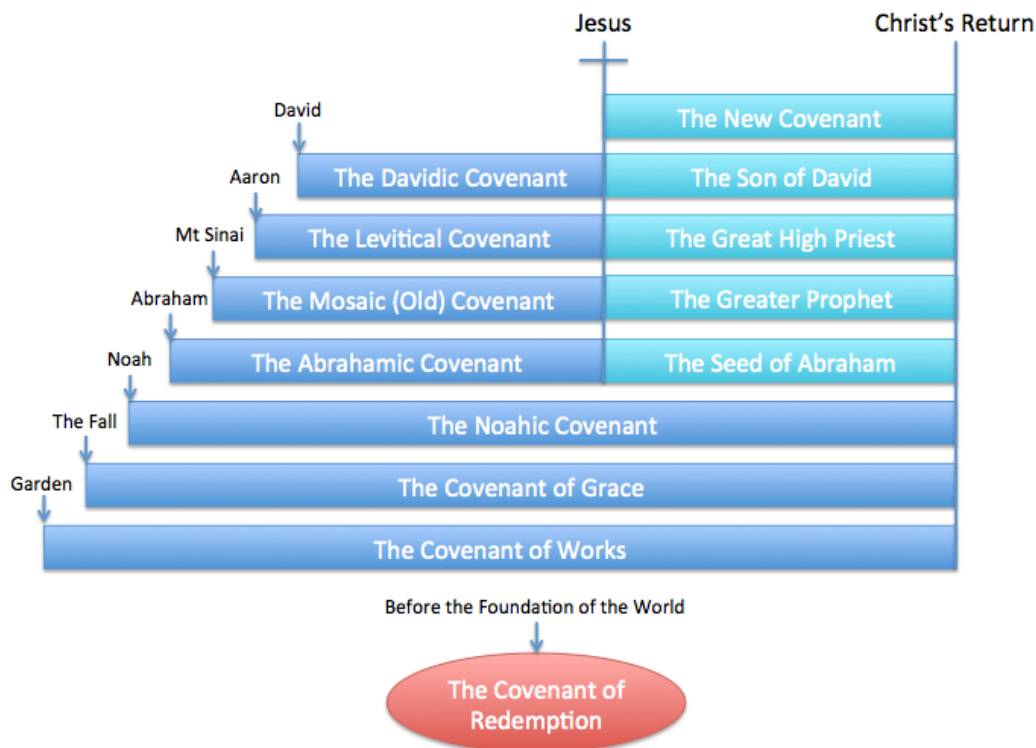




Introduction

The Father's Will and the Son's Will Excursus

- John 10:30 – Jesus and the Father are one
- John 6:38 – Jesus submits to the will of the Father
- Jesus's divine nature has the same will as the Father.
- The Father's and the Son's divine will are the same but the Son's human will defers to the Father.
- The mystery of the Trinity is glorious and unfathomable.
