Love- agape

Deuteronomy 6:5 You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

An inexplicable power of soul given in the inward person⁴

Deuteronomy 13:4 You shall walk after the LORD your God and fear him and keep his commandments and obey his voice, and you shall serve him and hold fast to him.

Does justice to the feeling of love⁵

Love without action is lies,

In the NT love is always described in terms of what it does, it is always a verb doing something for someone,

It seeks the highest good of others, it is not selfish, it is what Christ modeled for us.

We see it perfectly as God gave His son for the sins of the world, and John tells us this is what love is and that we should do the same.

You could occupy yourself in the most fulfilling way for the rest of your life by striving to live this out. It is all consuming, all encompassing, and all fulfilling.

What Paul is praying for God to give them an abundance of Paul is now urging them to put into practice, to let grow and distribute.

It is like a farmer tending his crop; planting, harvesting, keeping the weeds out, even though God must supply the increase.

How can we love our fellow believers more and more?

Be open to the conviction of the Spirit of ways you are not loving others as God would have you to.

How to do view people, judgmental, instead of helping?

How do you serve people, we should do this, are you helping?

How do you encourage people, they should do this, are you helping?

Anybody can point out faults, it takes mature dedicated people to make progress in areas that need correction. 6 to 1 ratio

This is why the New Testament is emphatic in saying love is the crowing virtue that binds us together.
