of the world" in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:14), the prophet Isaiah shared, with the people of Israel, God's desire for them to be a "light for the nations" (Isaiah 42:6, 49:6, 60:3).

Isaiah prophesied during a time of great trouble for the Israelites. Exiled from their homeland of Jerusalem and away from the temple of God, and therefore away from God's presence, the people of God felt tremendous despair over their situation. Throughout the letter, Isaiah refers to their situation as one of "darkness". This "darkness" was brought about by the people of God abandoning Yahweh for the gods of other nations. In other words, they allowed the surrounding cultures and their immoral practices to shape them instead of shaping the surrounding cultures with the truth of God (Isaiah 5:20). They stopped being a light and found themselves swept away into darkness (Isaiah 50:10).

God would not leave His people in that state. Isaiah prophesied of a time when God's people would once again be a light to the world. This brings us back to Jesus, who came as the light (John 8:12) to show us how to become that light ourselves (John 12:35-36) and bring others out of their love of the darkness to something much better (John 3:20-21; 12:46).

Long before Jesus said the words "You are the light "You are the light of the world", this is a phrase of responsibility. There is a world around us looking for hope, peace, and freedom. This can only truly be found in Jesus. What will you do with this little light of yours?


