

Sermon Discussion Guide 12.11.22 Message | Tyler Myers | Psalm 77:1-20

Key Scriptures:

"Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the people of Israel: you shall say to them, 'The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.'"

Numbers 6:23-26

Then I said, "I will appeal to this, to the years of the right hand of the Most High." I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your wonders of old. I will ponder all your work, and meditate on your mighty deeds. Your way, O God, is holy. What god is great like our God? Conversation Starter:

How does settling for the faux peace the world offers affect your relationship with Jesus, the true source of peace?



Discuss the Message:

- 1. What sticks out to you from the first part of the blessing Moses declared to the people of Israel in Numbers 6:24?
 - a. In all honesty, where else do you look for blessings apart from the Lord?
 - b. How does Numbers 6:24-26 as a spoken blessing reinforce the need to pursue peace in order to live in the promise of peace?
 - c. What does it practically look like to pursue peace as a follower of Christ?
- 2. Read Psalm 77:1-20. What are some of the sentiments you can relate to in verses 1-9?
 - a. What does the author say in Psalm 77:11 that changes the whole tone of the chapter?
 - b. What are some of the marvelous works God has done in your life that help you to hold onto peace amidst the storms of life?
 - c. How do the Psalmists' words in Psalm 77:10-20 model the practice of taking the focus off of "me" and placing the focus on God?
- 3. The breadth of God's peace is especially on display in Psalm 77:16-20; discuss which depiction of his peace impacts you most.
 - a. Do you ever shortchange, or underestimate, God's ability to offer you peace? How so?
 - b. How does knowing that peace is more than a pathway or a perspective, rather it is the person Jesus, alter your understanding and appreciation of peace?

Father God, the Prince of Peace, we worship you! Right now, we want to slow our breaths and to truly soak in your holy presence. We admit that this season is usually marked by anything but peace, but we want to recommit to pursuing the person of peace, Jesus Christ.
