## The <u>LORD</u> is My Shepherd

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

## He Will Provide: My Physical Needs

<sup>2</sup> He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters.

## He Will Provide: My Spiritual Needs

<sup>3</sup> He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

## He Will Provide: Defense In Every Trial

<sup>4</sup> Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort

## <u>He Will Provide:</u> **Deliverance From Every Enemy**

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<sup>5</sup>You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

# He Will Provide: Unconditional, Unfailing, & Everlasting Love

<sup>6</sup>Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

#### **Notes**

#### V1 DAVID RECOGNIZES THE LORD AS HIS "SHEPHERD" WHO MEETS HIS EVERY NEED, GUIDES & DEFENDS HIS LIFE, & IS HIS EVER-PRESENT HELP.

- Dear ones, this is how we too must look to God. It is no sign of weakness to depend upon the Lord, but rather a sign of true humility & true wisdom. Nor should we think that our constant neediness is a burden to God. No!
- Such is the greatness of our Shepherd's strength that <u>he cannot be exhausted</u>, & such is the depth of his tender love that <u>he is always ready to care for those whose trust is in him</u>. He delights in tending to his flock. ((Pet. 5:7)
- This Shepherd is <u>all-wise</u>, <u>all-powerful</u>, & <u>everywhere-present</u>. He is the <u>eternal</u> & <u>unchangeable</u> God who is "<u>merciful</u> and <u>gracious</u>, <u>slow to anger</u>, and <u>abounding in steadfast love</u> and <u>faithfulness</u>…" (Ex. 34:6)
- It is only w/ this "LORD" as your shepherd that you can say with David: "I will never lack what is needful to me."\*

#### V2 CONTAINS A PROMISE OF GOD'S CONTINUAL PROVISION FOR THE NEEDS OF OUR EARTHLY BODIES: NOURISHMENT & SECURITY

- Green pastures & gentle waters represent how the shepherd meets the essential physical needs of his sheep.
- The sheep "lie down" b/c, under their shepherd's care, they are well supplied & have a deep sense of security.
- The psalm explicitly declares that these things are not obtained as a result of the sheep's own <u>determination</u>, <u>wisdom</u>, <u>wealth</u>, or <u>toil</u>. They are <u>exclusively provided by the Shepherd</u>'s own perfect wisdom & daily leadership.
- Dear ones, we need not be anxious or fearful when we belong to the Lord Most High. For "the whole earth is the Lord's & all the fullness thereof.." (Ps. 24:1) & our Shepherd has promised daily bread to the children of his love.

#### V3 CONTAINS A PROMISE OF GOD'S CONTINUAL PROVISION FOR THE NEEDS OF OUR SOULS: BOTH FORGIVENESS OF SIN & GUIDANCE FOR HOLY LIVING

- The word "<u>restore</u>" means "<u>to return</u>". In the context of sheep, this means that a sheep has first <u>wandered away</u> from the shepherd. There are lots of ways this might happen. (i.e. Temptation, Rebellion, Apathy, Ignorance, Deception, Etc.)\*
- Whatever the case, v3 depicts a sheep who has gone astray—that is, a person who has sinned against God.
- In 10,000 different ways, this is exactly who each of us are. We are all sinners who have turned away from God.
- Yet, look at the heart of this merciful Shepherd! He is a Restorer of the guilty, a Forgiver of the rebellious. (Lk. 19:10)
- Ours is a Shepherd who searches for his sheep when they foolishly rebel against him & stray from his side.
- Ours is a Shepherd who not only finds the lost sheep, but once found, restores them into the fold of his love.
- And yet, he does still more. Our God <u>not only forgives our sins</u> but also <u>changes our hearts</u> & <u>guides us in</u> "<u>righteous paths</u>." He teaches us, by his Word & Spirit, how to walk before his face in true holiness & happiness.

#### V4 CONTAINS A PROMISE OF GOD'S CONTINUAL DEFENSE AMIDST ALL THE VARIED CHALLENGES WE WILL FACE AS PILGRIMS IN THIS FALLEN WORLD.

- "Valley of the shadow of death" is a metaphor for the trials & temptations we must continually face in this life.
- Things like: Sin, sickness, sorrow, suffering, betrayal, failure, hurt, loss, abuse, divorce, rejection, & much more.
- Q: HOW CAN A PERSON HONESTLY STARE ALL THE POSSIBLE EVILS OF THIS FALLEN WORLD IN THE FACE & SAY, "I WILL NOT FEAR THEM"?
- David's lack of fear is not based on the absence of problems. It is based on the <u>Presence</u> & <u>Protection</u> of God.
- . David clings to the promise of the shepherd's presence: "For your are with Me..."
  - By faith David knows that wherever he goes & whatever he faces in this life, he will never face it alone.
- 2. David Clings to the promise of the shepherd's protection: "Your Cudgel & Your Crook, they comfort Me..."
  - By faith, David knows that his Shepherd will never fail to defend him from whatever enemies he may face.
- With the *cudgel*, our Shepherd <u>defends us from our enemies</u>, & with the *crook* he <u>defends us from ourselves</u>.\*

#### V5 CONTAINS A PROMISE OF GOD'S ULTIMATE DELIVERANCE FROM OUR EVERY ENEMY: SIN, THE WORLD, PERSECUTORS, SATAN, DEATH, ETC.

• This verse is meant to teach us this truth: Every enemy of God & of his people will ultimately be conquered & rendered totally powerless as we, his beloved Church, enjoy the full measure of his lavish grace for all eternity.\*

#### V6 CONTAINS A PROMISE OF GOD'S UNCONDITIONAL, UNFAILING, & EVERLASTING LOVE FOR EVERY BELOVED SHEEP IN HIS PRECIOUS FLOCK (THE CHURCH)

- These words do NOT merely promise that God will be good & merciful to his people—as wonderful as this is.
- These verses promise that the goodness & mercy of God will "relentlessly pursue" his people. (Chasing after them)
- For how long will such holy, comprehensive, & radically undeserved love be ours to enjoy? Forever. (Isa. 54:10)
- For all eternity this Good Shepherd will love, defend, and keep the precious sheep of his love. (Jn. 10:27-30)

#### **Proposition:**

Dear ones, can you tell me one good reason that you should not repent & place your faith in this Good Shepherd?
