RESCUING OUR JOY FROM THE PRISON OF PRIDE - Phil. 2

I. PRIDE IMPEDES THE JOY OF GOD'S GRACE RELEASE - Phil. 2:1 / James 4:5-7
A) The joy we receive from His <u>ASSURANCE</u> is a gift of grace
B) The joy we receive from His <u>AFFECTION</u> is a gift of grace
C) The joy we receive from His <u>ACCEPTANCE</u> is a gift of grace

IV. PRIDE INTERFERES WITH THE JOY OF RECEIVING - Phil. 2:17-24
A) The proud DISMISS those who may be younger
B) The proud DISDAIN those of lesser experience
C) The proud DESPISE those of less importance
V. PRIDE IMPRISONS THE JOY OF REJOICING - Phil. 2:25-30
A) The proud see another's burden as an IMPOSITION
B) The proud see another's blessing with INDIFFERENCE
