## PHILEMON - CHOOSING A LEGACY OF LOVE

INTRODUCTION: Paul is under house arrest in Rome where he wrote the Epistles to the Ephesians, Philippians, and Colossians. This most personal of all the letters Paul wrote arrives in Colosse by the hand of Tychicus, who also delivered the letter to the church. Also present is Onesimus, Philemon's thieving, runaway slave, who had fled to Rome, and eventually was led to Christ by Paul. This letter is Paul's appeal for Philemon's forgiveness and acceptance of Onesimus.
