Mark 1:4-12 (NKJV)

4 John came baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. 5 Then all the land of Judea, and those from Jerusalem, went out to him and were all baptized by him in the Jordan River, confessing their sins. 6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair and with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. 7 And he preached, saying, "There comes One after me who is mightier than I, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to stoop down and loose. **8 I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.**" 9 It came to pass in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was **baptized** by John **in the Jordan**. 10 And immediately, coming up from the water, He saw the heavens parting and **the Spirit descending upon Him like a dove**. 11 Then a voice came from heaven, "You are My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." 12 Immediately the Spirit drove Him into the wilderness.

Verse 12... "Immediately the Spirit drove Him into the wilderness."

JESUS WAS BAPTIZED TWICE!

1: He was baptized in water

2: He was baptized by the Holy Spirit

THE DISCIPLES WERE BAPTIZED THREE TIMES!

1: Baptism of Salvation

2: Baptism in the Holy Spirit

3: Baptism in Water

John 20:21–22 (NKJV)

21 So Jesus said to them again, “Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.”

22 And when He had said this, He **breathed on *them***, and said to them, “**Receive the Holy Spirit...**”

Mark 1: 8...

“I indeed baptized you with water, but He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit”

Greek = “with” = preposition...

Meaning = IN

John 14:17 (NKJV)

“... He dwells **with you** and will be **in you**.”

Acts 1:4–8 (NKJV)

4 And being assembled together with *them*, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, “which,” *He said*, “you have heard from Me; 5 for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.” 6 Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, “Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?” 7 And He said to them, “It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. 8 But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come **upon** you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”

Acts 2:1–4 (NKJV)

1 When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. 2 And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and *one* sat upon each of them. 4 And they were all **filled** with **the Holy Spirit** and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

GREEK = Filled = eplethesan

Eplethesan = root verb = pimplemi...

Pimplemi = to fill up, to make full, or to be totally influenced, controlled, and empowered from within.

The Root Verb of Pimplemi = To permeate completely, like wind filling a sail or a house.
