Advent: Good News, Great Joy, All People

"A Google Maps View of Christmas" Small Group Discussion Guide

Opening Question (get everyone involved in discussion):

- What is one experience that made you feel small? (Examples: looking at some wonder of creation, or being in a huge crowd at Times Square, etc.).
- Begin your time together with a moment of silence, then pray and ask for God's Spirit to reveal himself through his word.
- 1. **Read Luke 2:1-7 several times:** read it out loud as a group once. Then read it out loud again in a different translation. Lastly, read it silently as individuals. Then discuss the following.
 - Did you notice anything new or fresh in this reading of the passage?
 - What questions did this reading raise?
 - What psychological impact would a worldwide census have had on Caesar Augustus? What impact would it have had on common people, like Mary and Joseph?
 - Which of God's promises is Caesar unwittingly enabling to be fulfilled? There are at least two, maybe more. (Read Micah 5:2 and 2 Samuel 7:12-13 for details).
 - **Application**: what people, circumstances, or current events cause you to feel that God's plans are threatened, or God is not able to carry out his purposes in your life?
 - On Sunday, Josh said that in this story, we see how **God is working over and through the events of history to save the world**.
 - Does this principle bring you any comfort? Why or why not?
 - How do we see the same principle playing out in the crucifixion of Jesus? (See Acts 4:27-28).
- 2. **Zoom in on Mary and Joseph for a few minutes.** What factors in their lives— in the eyes of Jewish culture and the rest of the world—make them unlikely candidates to give birth to the Savior of the world?
 - On Sunday, Pastor Josh discussed several details of this Nativity story that our Christian Culture has muddled a bit. How did that discussion strike you?
 - The point of this discussion was that God gave the gift that would fulfill his ancient promises and save the world in the least expected, most mundane of circumstances.
 Do you think that this point has any relevance to us today? Why or why not?
 - What similarities can you see between the manner in which Jesus came into the world, and the manner he gave his life to save the world?
 - The big takeaway from the sermon was that <u>in the ordinary routines of life, God</u> <u>does extraordinary things.</u>
 - \circ Do you think that this is an accurate conclusion to draw from the story? Why or why not?
 - \circ What aspects of your life make it seem that God could not do anything significant through you?

- \circ What do you think that you would have to do in order to be used in God's world-changing plans?
- How might your daily existence change if you really believed that God does his most impactful work through ordinary people and circumstances?

Prayer:

- Pray about any themes, insights, or challenges that have arisen through the discussion.
- Take a moment to share, and pray for any other needs that exist among your group members.
