After each Sunday morning service, we will study the passages assigned for the day. CK Wang has faithfully hosted the study after the 8:00 am service for many years. He will continue to do so. We will add the parish clergy to take the offering after the 10:00 am and Noon services. Grab a snack and come study the scripture assigned for the day!



QUEST CLASS: PREPARING FOR SACRAMENTS

Six Wednesday evenings: April 10th, 17th, 24th and May 1st, 8th, and 16th. Each night will start with dinner at 6 pm followed by formation from 6:30 - 8 pm. This is available for those interested in Confirmation, anyone interested in renewal of their faith, or those who would like a refresher of the Faith.

For the first three weeks of our six-week course, we will cover theological topics of Christianity: Why did Jesus Die? Who is the Holy Spirit? Do we really need to be baptized? In the second three weeks of our six-week course, we will cover Episcopal topics: What is the History of the Episcopal Church? How is the Episcopal Church governed and structured compared to other denominations? And how am I to discern the next phase of my life?

These and related topics are covered in our six weeks. The course concludes on Pentecost Sunday when those who wish will be Confirmed or will Reaffirm their faith. We will use the book "Walk in Love" from Forward Movement, and a copy will be supplied to all participants.

We'll plan a time to discuss what Baptism means and the promises you'll be making as parents/guardians. The next Baptism date is the Second Sunday of Easter, April 7 during the 10:00 am service. Other dates can be available.

Adults: Prepare for Baptism, Confirmation, or Reception into the Episcopal Church by participating in **Quest Class**:

April 10, 17, 24, and May 1, 8, and 15. Each night will start with dinner at 6 pm followed by formation from 6:30 - 8 pm.

Youth and Adults:

- The next Baptism date is **Saturday, March 30th** during our 7:00 pm Easter Vigil Eucharist.
- The next Confirmation is **Sunday, May 19th** at the 10 am service.

The reason for two different times at Easter (*and only for Easter*) is simply the person's age. We think a two+ hour service for Easter Vigil on Saturday night probably doesn't work for small ones, so we have the 2nd Sunday of Easter season as an alternative.
