BLACK HISTORY MONTH WEEK 3 FEATURED NOTABLE FIGURE: BOOKER T. WASHINGTON

"The happiest people are those who do the most for others. The most miserable are those who do the least." — Booker T. Washington



Booker T. Washington (April 5, 1856 – November 14, 1915) was an American educator, author, and orator. Between 1890 and 1915, Washington was the primary leader in the African-American community. He was born in a slave hut but, after emancipation, moved with his family to Malden, West Virginia. Dire poverty ruled out regular schooling; at age nine he began working, first in a salt furnace and later in a coal mine. Determined to get an education, he enrolled at the Hampton Normal and Agricultural Institute (now Hampton University) in Virginia (1872), working as a janitor to help pay expenses. He graduated in 1875 and returned to Malden, where for two years he taught children in a day school and adults at night. Following studies at Wayland Seminary, Washington, D.C. (1878–79), he joined the staff of Hampton.

In 1881 Washington was selected to head a newly established normal school for African Americans at Tuskegee, an institution with two small converted buildings, no equipment, and very little money. Tuskegee Normal and Industrial Institute became a monument to his life's work. Washington believed that the best interests of Black people in the post-Reconstruction era could be realized through education in the crafts and industrial skills and the cultivation of the virtues of patience, enterprise, and thrift. He urged his fellow Blacks, most of whom were impoverished and illiterate farm labourers, to temporarily abandon their efforts to win full civil rights and political power and instead to cultivate their industrial and farming skills so as to attain economic security.

A MESSAGE FROM FACILITIES DIRECTOR, MATT HORNSBY

In early December a cathedral staff member reported seeing a slight shifting of 2 windows in their 4th floor office. I immediately contacted Schaefer Engineering to conduct a structural inspection of the 4th-floor north wall of the parish house. Schaefers inspection revealed a deteriorating pier behind the brick facade. The engineer assured us that there was no immediate danger, however it needed to be repaired as soon as possible. **Work began on February 5th and is expected to take five weeks.**

Unfortunately, several areas of the cathedral need to be closed during construction. Closed areas include the 5th-floor gymnasium, 4th-floor NE office, 3rd-floor forum room, and the Library. *Please note that during this time Sunday Coffee Hours will be moved to the Undercroft.* If you have an event or meeting scheduled in the library or 3rd-floor forum room during this time, Michelle Hornsby will be reaching out if you have not already been contacted. She will provide you with the new space where these meetings or events will be relocating to.
