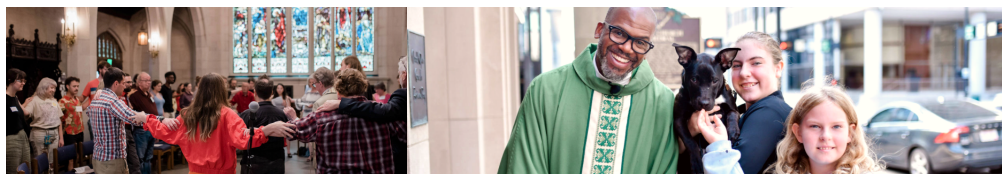

BLACK HISTORY MONTH WEEK 1 FEATURED NOTABLE FIGURE: SOJOURNER TRUTH

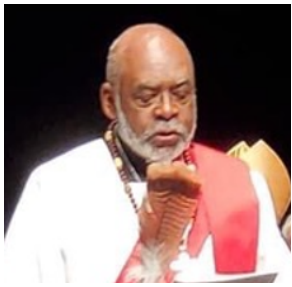
Sojourner Truth: 1797 –1883. Activist for African American civil rights and women’s rights. Sojourner Truth, born Isabella Baumfree was born into slavery in Swartekill, New York, but escaped with her infant daughter to freedom in 1826. After going to court to recover her son in 1828, she became the first black woman to win such a case against a white man.



She gave herself the name Sojourner Truth in 1843 after she became convinced that God had called her to leave the city and go into the countryside "testifying to the hope that was in her." [5] Her best-known speech was delivered extemporaneously, in 1851, at the Ohio Women's Rights Convention in Akron, Ohio. The speech became widely known during the Civil War by the title "Ain't I a Woman?"

During the Civil War, Truth helped recruit black troops for the Union Army; after the war, she tried unsuccessfully to secure land grants from the federal government for formerly enslaved people (summarized as the promise of "forty acres and a mule"). She continued to fight on behalf of women and African Americans until her death.

Brother Powell, (Cherokee/Saponi) and his wife, Anne, are Deacons-in-Residence at St. Augustine Episcopal Church, Rocklin, CA. He is a graduate of the Episcopal School for Deacons, Berkeley, CA., and was ordained in Grace Cathedral, San Francisco, CA. He is the former Archdeacon of the Diocese of the Rio Grande and Episcopal Chaplain for the University of New Mexico. He has been a representative of the Episcopal Church to the Anglican Indigenous Network.

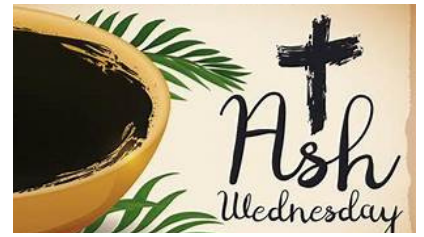
Brother Powell is an advocate for addressing the effects of the Doctrine of Discovery in the Church and authored the Indigenous Lands Acknowledgement Resolution approved in 2022.

A MESSAGE FROM FACILITIES DIRECTOR, MATT HORNSBY

In early December a cathedral staff member reported seeing a slight shifting of 2 windows in their 4th floor office. I immediately contacted Schaefer Engineering to conduct a structural inspection of the 4th-floor north wall of the parish house. Schaefer's inspection revealed a deteriorating pier behind the brick facade. The engineer assured us that there was no immediate danger, however it needed to be repaired as soon as possible. **Work is scheduled to begin on February 5th and is expected to take five weeks.**

Unfortunately, several areas of the cathedral need to be closed during construction. Closed areas include the 5th-floor gymnasium, 4th-floor NE office, 3rd-floor forum room, and the Library. *Please note that during this time Sunday Coffee Hours will be moved to the Undercroft.*

If you have an event or meeting scheduled in the library or 3rd-floor forum room during this time, Michelle Hornsby will be reaching out if you have not already been contacted. She will provide you with the new space where these meetings or events will be relocating to.

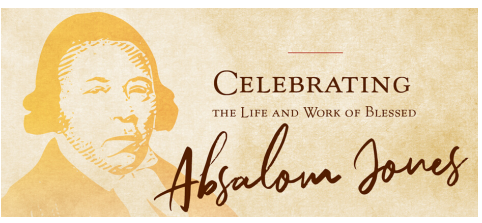
HEARTS AND HANDS MINISTRY UPCOMING MONTHLY GATHERING

SOUL GOODS 2024 FIRST QUARTER COMMUNITY PARTNER

Our partner for the First quarter of 2024 is Save Our Youth Kings & Queens. The program "Save Our Youth — Kings and Queens" in Cincinnati is a mentorship program for troubled youth. It starts with a referral from the juvenile court system, police, schools, and other agencies to get the teens the support they need. After referral, the at-risk youths participate in a three-month program with meetings twice a month.
