COMMUNITY REFLECTION

Please be seated after the reading. Now, a brief reflection is offered and all are welcome to share. Seek to listen without judgment. Seek to speak with compassionate integrity. Seek to respond (rather than react) to the ideas others have shared and make connections. Seek to be curious and find common threads. Seek to befriend the silence between spoken words. If we disagree: may we disagree gracefully; may we be challenged and yet inspired; may we be uncomfortable and yet awakened; and may the Spirit guide us.

AFFIRMATION of FAITH

We conclude our conversation with a reminder of who we are together as the body of Christ. With this affirmation of faith written years ago by sisters connected to the Iona Community in protest of nuclear weapons.

All: We believe that God is present in the darkness before dawn;

**in the waiting and uncertainty where fear and courage join hands,
conflict and caring link arms, and the sun rises over barbed wire.**

We believe in a with-us God who sits down in our midst to share our humanity.

We affirm a faith that takes us beyond the safe place into action, into vulnerability and into the streets.

**We commit ourselves to work for change and put us on the line;
to bear responsibility, to take risks, live powerfully and face humiliation;
to stand with those on the edge; to choose life and be used by the Spirit
for God’s new community of hope. Amen.**

PRAYERS of the PEOPLE

Officiant: Let us pray for the church and for the world:

For the hungry and the over overfed
May we have enough.

For the mourners and the mockers
May we laugh together.

For the victims and the oppressors
May we share power wisely.

For the peacemakers and the warmongers



May clear truth and stern love lead us to harmony.

For the silenced and the propagandists

May we speak our own words in truth.

For the unemployed and the overworked

May our impress on the earth be kindly and creative.

For the troubled and the sleek

May we live together as wounded healers.

For the homeless and the cosseted

May our homes be simple, warm and welcoming.

For the vibrant and the dying

May we all die to live.

Officiant: We pray specifically for those in our community who have requested prayer. We pray for [...]. We also invite this community to name anyone they are holding in prayer this week... (silently or aloud).

Officiant: O God, you made us in your own image and redeemed us through Jesus your Son: Look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; unite us in bonds of love; and work through our struggle and confusion to accomplish your purposes on earth; that, in your good time, all nations and races may serve you in harmony around your heavenly throne; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

Creator, we disfigure your world.

Lord, have mercy.

Redeemer, we reject your redemption and crucify you daily.

Christ, have mercy.

Giver of life, we too often choose death.

Lord, have mercy.

Officiant: Through the death and resurrection of Christ, and by the power of the Holy Spirit washed over us in baptism, we have been freed from sin and death. Hear again this good news: God forgives all our sins. We are free to live the new life that is ours in Christ. **Amen.**

THE PEACE

In the tradition of our ancient faith, we prepare ourselves for Holy Eucharist by offering peace and reconciliation to our neighbor. You can say "Peace be with you" or something similar.

The Peace of Christ be with you always.

And also with you.

TIME of OFFERING and SONG

You have so many gifts. As the children parade gifts to the altar, this time is set aside as an opportunity to give yourself, your gifts, your finances, your time, etc. over again to God and to neighbor.

THE THANKSGIVING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you!

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant guides the community in prayer over the Holy Supper...

... we praise you, singing:

**Holy, Holy, Holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory (x2)
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the One
who comes in the name of the Lord.**

Celebrant's prayer continues...

All respond: Come now, spirit of integrity, of tenderness, judgement, and dance; touch our speechlessness, kindle our longing, reach into our silence, and fire our words with your truth; that each may hear in her own language the mighty works of God. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ. Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

As Jesus taught us, we now pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

This is the table, not of the righteous, but of the poor in spirit. It is made ready for those who love God and who want to love God more. So come, you who have much faith and you who have little, you who have been here often and you who have not been for a long time or ever before, You who have tried to follow and all of us who have failed. These are the gifts of God for the People of God. Christ invites everyone to be known and fed here.

BREAKING of the BREAD

The body and blood of Christ. Behold what you are. Become what you receive.
