1. HURTING PEOPLE HURT PEOPLE.

Luke 19:1-10 (NASB) ¹He entered Jericho and was passing through. ²And there was a man called by the name of **Zaccheus**; he was a chief tax collector and he was rich. ³Zaccheus was trying to see who Jesus was, and was unable because of the crowd, for he was small in stature. ⁴So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree in order to see Him, for He was about to pass through that way.
