The earth holds its breath, waiting. Advent is a season of longing, a yearly representation in our church calendar of the eons of time spanning from the moment Eve took the first bite of the fruit until that starry night when Heaven touched earth and Christ incarnated, becoming God-man. Fully human. Fully God. Advent culminates in the arrival of Jesus-Messiah in the flesh, born as a human child to the last people on earth who anyone would have chosen to parent a king!

Explanation of Advent Theme: Law – Dan Anthony

The kingdom of God is in the midst of you. Those in Bethlehem and beyond failed to note the significance of His arrival – His advent, of the star in the east or the strange clamor of the shepherds that night – wandering and rejoicing through the streets. One who did take note wanted to kill him. Even so, God has given us clear instruction on how we ought to live and wait for His great day. On this third Sunday of Advent, we light a candle to honor the law of God. In the law, the Father shows us the beauty of His Kingdom in our midst – His heart of righteousness and His holy authority to rule. The Word made flesh, God's law wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger, comes that we too might live and pray "Thy Kingdom come; thy will be done."

Call to Worship/Lighting of Advent Candle

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

The Helm Family – Isaiah 65:17-19, 25 (ESV)

"For behold, I create new heavens and a new earth, and the former things shall not be remembered or come into mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in that which I create; for behold, I create Jerusalem to be a joy, and her people to be a gladness. I will rejoice in Jerusalem and be glad in my people; no more shall be heard in it the sound of weeping and the cry of distress...The wolf and the lamb shall graze together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, and dust shall be the serpent's food. They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain," says the Lord.

Prayer of Adoration and Confession - Dan Anthony

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

Assurance of Pardon

We again read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works.

Seasons of the Cross

Blue for Advent: Blue has historically been associated with this season, a picture of the darkness before the dawn. In Romans, Paul writes, "For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the sons of God...in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God." Freedom begins with the birth of the Christ. (ref. Rom 8:19, 20b, 21)

Text: Luke 2:8-20 (ESV)

Title: Good News For The Lowly

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.
⁹ And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased!" ¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Intro: Of all people, the LORD sent His announcement to shepherds...

THE HUMBLE ARE TOLD GOOD NEWS

Why is it significant that shepherds were told good news?

THEY ACT ON WHAT THEY SAW Instead of only being told that something's good, what changes when you experience it yourself? YOU CAN PRAY WITH US... 1. Worship the LORD for His graciousness to the humble. Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, for being true to His Word: "Thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to

revive the heart of the contrite." (Isaiah 57:15)

4. Who do you know that struggles with humbling themselves? Pray for them, asking the Lord to help them see the glory of how HE humbled Himself to save people like us.

How have you lived resisting (and resenting) ever being in need? Confess your pride to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you for denying reality and to help you humbly trust Him to be what He says He is - Savior, Christ, the LORD.
