Call to Worship

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

1 Corinthians 1:18-20, 26-31 (ESV)

For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?

For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

Confession of Sin

Almighty God, we acknowledge and confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed; we have not loved you with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength; we have not loved our neighbor as ourselves. Lord, you are full of compassion and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in mercy; there is always forgiveness with you! Restore to us the joy of your salvation; bind up that which is broken, give light to our minds, strength to our wills, and rest to our souls. Speak to each of us, and let your word abide with us until it has conformed us to your holy will. Amen.

Assurance of Pardon

We again read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ. 1 Peter 3:13-18 (ESV)

Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good? But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil. For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit.

Confession of Faith

Particularly, in this season after Pentecost, we strive to live in and through the power and presence of the Holy Spirit - praying and living so as to display and declare the glory of Jesus in all we do.

Text: Acts 9:13-16, 2 Corinthians 11:24-28, 12:7-10 (ESV)

Title: Suffering for Jesus

^{9:13} But Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints at Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on your name." ¹⁵ But the Lord said to him, "Go, for he is a chosen instrument of mine to carry my name before the Gentiles and kings and the children of Israel. ¹⁶ For I will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name."

^{11:24} Five times I received at the hands of the Jews the forty lashes less one. ²⁵ Three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned. Three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I was adrift at sea; ²⁶ on frequent journeys, in danger from rivers, danger from robbers, danger from my own people, danger from Gentiles, danger in the city, danger in the wilderness, danger at sea, danger from false brothers; ²⁷ in toil and hardship, through many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst, often without food, in cold and exposure. ²⁸ And, apart from other things, there is the daily pressure on me of my anxiety for all the churches.

^{12:7} So to keep me from becoming conceited because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from becoming conceited. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰ For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. Intro: In Acts 21-23, Paul's story takes a profound turn.

OBSTACLES & DIVERSIONS

How can evil and suffering trip us up or deflect our attention away from the LORD?

HOPEFUL IN OPPOSITION If God's ultimate mission is to redeem – to reverse the impact of evil – what changes if you're allied with Him?
YOU CAN PRAY WITH US
1. Worship the LORD for His power, wisdom and love (recall, <i>God Incarnate atoning</i>). Praise Him, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for His surpassing worth even if we're called upon to suffer for our allegiance to Him.
2. How have you lived avoiding suffering at any cost, even where it is tied to your loyalty to Jesus? Confess your fear and pride to Jesus, asking Him to forgive you and secure you by His immeasurable grace and worth.
3. Give thanks to Jesus for all that He has done to suffer to save you. Thank Him for bearing the punishment that brings you peace, and for giving you His own Spirit (His sufficiency) to sustain you in a hostile environment.

4. Who do you know that has suffered for their faithfulness to Jesus? Pray for them, asking the Lord to strengthen and

5. Ask the Holy Spirit to bear in you the fruit of faithfulness, especially in sharing your faith. Pray for courage to tell

help them, especially to help them trust in Jesus' ability to turn all evil around for their good.
