

When you read this verse, "You spread out our sins before you— our secret sins—and you see them all." Psalm 90:8 (NLT), how does it make you feel?

Review the first three message points and verses.

How does this impact your thinking about your life and story?

Read the following and reflect on the potential impact your life can have. Ask God to help you live up to the great opportunity you have to represent Him as the hero of your life.

¹⁷ This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun! 18 And all of this is a gift from God, who brought us back to himself through Christ. And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him. 19 For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, no longer counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation. ²⁰ So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead. "Come back to God!" 21 For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ.



Jeremiah 23:24 (NLT)

1. Pretending, hiding, or ignoring doesn't change the truth.

You spread out our sins before you — our secret sins—and you see them all.

Psalm 90:8 (NLT)

For all that is secret will eventually be brought into the open, and everything that is concealed will be brought to light and made known to all.

Luke 8:17 (NLT)

God will judge us for everything we do, including every secret thing, whether good or bad.

Ecclesiastes 12:14 (NLT)

2. Facing the truth about ourselves and God, opens the door to <u>true love and freedom</u>.

²⁸ Then Jesus said, "Come to me, all of you who are weary and carry heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you. Let me teach you, because I am humble and gentle at heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy to bear, and the burden I give you is light."

Matthew 11:28–30 (NLT)

3. A key that unlocks all of this is humility.

⁵ And all of you, dress yourselves in humility as you relate to one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." ⁶ So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time he will lift you up in honor. ⁷ Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you. ⁸ Stay alert! Watch out for your great enemy, the devil. He prowls around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to devour. ⁹ Stand firm against him, and be strong in your faith.
