This week, we exposed four ways the church has wrongly represented Jesus and what we should be doing instead.

The following episode from Jesus' life is a perfect case study in representing God wrongly and rightly. In this situation, Jesus is surrounded by a large crowd who are listening carefully. Imagine you are there watching this show-down between Him and His opponents.

<sup>1</sup> But Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. <sup>2</sup> At dawn he appeared again in the temple courts, where all the people gathered around him, and he sat down to teach them. 3 The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group 4 and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery. <sup>5</sup> In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?" 6 They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger. <sup>7</sup> When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "If any one of you is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." 8 Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground. 9 At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there. 10 Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" 11 "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin." John 8:1-11 (NIV) How do you see the four ways the church gets it wrong play out in this confrontation?

What do the Pharisees and teachers value most?

What does Jesus value most?

Why do you think the woman and not the man she was with were brought out publicly?

What was the woman expecting?

Jesus forgives her and then says, "Go and leave your life of sin." How do you think she reflected on things when she went home?

What will you take away from this as you think about and respond to people around you?

Four Ways the Church Gets it Wrong and Can Do Better

#### Judging others rather than loving them.

<sup>6</sup> They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. <sup>7</sup> They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, "All right, but let the one who has never sinned throw the first stone!" <sup>8</sup> Then he stooped down again and wrote in the dust. <sup>9</sup> When the accusers heard this, they slipped away one by one, beginning with the oldest, until only Jesus was left in the middle of the crowd with the woman. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus stood up again and said to the woman, "Where are your accusers? Didn't even one of them condemn you?" 11 "No, Lord," she said. And Jesus said, "Neither do I. Go and sin no more." John 8:6-11 (NLT)

Ranting about/to others rather than <u>listening</u> to them.

<sup>15</sup> Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, <sup>16</sup> keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander.

#### Acting hypocritically rather than humbly.

<sup>1</sup> Do not judge others, and you will not be judged. <sup>2</sup> For you will be treated as you treat others. The standard you use in judging is the standard by which you will be judged. <sup>3</sup> And why worry about a speck in your friend's eye when you have a log in your own? <sup>4</sup> How can you think of saying to your friend, 'Let me help you get rid of that speck in your eye,' when you can't see past the log in your own eye? <sup>5</sup> Hypocrite! First get rid of the log in your own eye; then you will see well enough to deal with the speck in your friend's eye.


### MISSION MUFFINS
