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## 1. When we <u>wrong</u> someone, <u>initiating repair</u> of the relationship is <u>our responsibility</u>.

<sup>23</sup> So if you are presenting a sacrifice at the altar in the Temple and you suddenly remember that someone has something against you, <sup>24</sup> leave your sacrifice there at the altar. Go and be reconciled to that person. Then come and offer your sacrifice to God.

Matthew 5:23-24 (NLT)

2. When we avoid righting our wrongs, we <u>forfeit opportunities</u> for <u>reconciliation</u> and <u>further separate ourselves from others</u>.

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1 John 1:8-10 (NLT)

### 3. It's <u>hypocritical</u> for us to ask God for <u>forgiveness</u> and choose to be <u>unforgiving</u> <u>towards others</u>.

<sup>14</sup> If you forgive those who sin against you, your heavenly Father will forgive you. <sup>15</sup> But if you refuse to forgive others, your Father will not forgive your sins.

Matthew 6:14-15 (NLT)

# 4. When it comes to forgiveness, we need to <u>seek regularly</u> and <u>give freely</u>.

<sup>21</sup> Then Peter came to him and asked, "Lord, how often should I forgive someone who sins against me? Seven times?" <sup>22</sup> No, not seven times, Jesus replied, 'but seventy times seven! Matthew 18:21-22 (NLT)

<sup>1</sup> One day Jesus said to his disciples, "There will always be temptations to sin, but what sorrow awaits the person who does the tempting! <sup>2</sup> It would be better to be thrown into the sea with a millstone hung around your neck than to cause one of these little ones to fall into sin. <sup>3</sup> So watch yourselves! If another believer sins, rebuke that person; then if there is repentance, forgive.

<sup>4</sup> Even if that person wrongs you seven times a day and each time turns again and asks forgiveness, you must forgive."

Luke 17:1-4 (NLT)

# 5. Seeking to right wrongs <u>leads to real</u> <u>freedom for us and the ones we hurt</u>.

Love prospers when a fault is forgiven, but dwelling on it separates close friends. Proverbs 17: 9 (NLT)
