Ted Lasso is <u>the kindest person</u> in his TV world.

Followers of Jesus should be the <u>most</u> <u>loving</u>, <u>patient</u>, <u>kind</u>, <u>gentle</u> and <u>good</u> people in the real world.

God's intent is that we become people that are <u>like Jesus</u>. And He has provided <u>all we need</u> to do it!

²² But the Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against these things!

Galatians 5:22–23 (NLT)

We should be <u>humble</u>, not foolish or naive.

We should be strong, not weak or wimpy.

We should be <u>truthful</u>, not merely people-pleasers.

Kindness chooses to "believe the best and inspect the rest".

Here is a simple, rule-of-thumb guide for behavior: Ask yourself what you want people to do for you, then grab the initiative and do it for them. Add up God's Law and Prophets and this is what you get.

Matthew 7:12 (MSG)

Kindness resists the temptation to be <u>crude</u>, <u>cruel</u> or "<u>cool</u>" at the expense of others.

²⁹ Don't use foul or abusive language. Let everything you say be good and helpful, so that your words will be an encouragement to those who hear them. ³⁰ And do not bring sorrow to God's Holy Spirit by the way you live. Remember, he has identified you as his own, guaranteeing that you will be saved on the day of redemption. ³¹ Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. ³² Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you.
