In The Covenant, we see a compelling picture of devotion. Anyone that watches the life of a follower of Jesus should see the same. Having been rescued by Christ, our response is love and obedience:

Those who accept my commandments and obey them are the ones who love me.

John 14:21 (NLT)

Being a servant or slave to God means I accept Him as the Leader/Lord of my life. He promises to give me a new life, free of my sin and full of hope, and I agree to trust and obey Him.

I can obey without loving God, but I cannot love God without obeying Him.

Here is a clear command God has given:

Owe nothing to anyone—except for your obligation to love one another. If you love your neighbor, you will fulfill the requirements of God's law.

covenant (def): a promise

First impressions are seldom accurate.

But the Lord said to Samuel, "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The Lord doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.
