Read Luke chapter 23 carefully and slowly, then review the message notes.

Imagine you were one of Pilate's advisors and he asked what you thought he should do. What advice might you have given him?

Now imagine you are Pilate and your career (and life) are on the line.

Being the governor meant administering justice, but in this case the political pressure on Pilate by the counsel was real. Sometimes doing the right thing can be costly. As followers of Jesus, we aren't immune to the cost, but we should have a greater ambition than our comfort, popularity, and security.

Think about the following verses, and how they may help you choose to be God's faithful man or woman this week:

Fearing people is a dangerous trap, but trusting the LORD means safety.

Proverbs 29:25 (NLT)

He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of men, but God knows your hearts. What is highly valued among men is detestable in God's sight."

Luke 16:15 (NIV)

⁴² Yet at the same time many even among the leaders believed in him. But because of the Pharisees they would not confess their faith for fear they would be put out of the synagogue; ⁴³ for they loved praise from men more than praise from God.

John 12:42-43 (NIV)

⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. ⁶ Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take. ⁷ Don't be impressed with your own wisdom. Instead, fear the LORD and turn away from evil.

Proverbs 3:5-7 (NLT)

The eyes of the LORD search the whole earth in order to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him.



¹ Then the entire council took Jesus to Pilate, the Roman governor. ² They began to state their case: "This man has been leading our people astray by telling them not to pay their taxes to the Roman government and by claiming he is the Messiah, a king." ³ So Pilate asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus replied. "You have said it." 4 Pilate turned to the leading priests and to the crowd and said. "I find nothing wrong with this man!" 5 Then they became insistent. "But he is causing riots by his teaching wherever he goes-all over Judea, from Galilee to Jerusalem!" 6 "Oh, is he a Galilean?" Pilate asked. 7 When they said that he was, Pilate sent him to Herod Antipas, because Galilee was under Herod's jurisdiction, and Herod happened to be in Jerusalem at the time.

Luke 23:1-7 (NLT)

Just then, as Pilate was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent him this message: "Leave that innocent man alone. I suffered through a terrible nightmare about him last night."

Matthew 27:19 (NLT)

²³ But the mob shouted louder and louder, demanding that Jesus be crucified, and their voices prevailed. ²⁴ So Pilate sentenced Jesus to die as they demanded. ²⁵ As they had requested, he released Barabbas, the man in prison for insurrection and murder. But he turned Jesus over to them to do as they wished.

Luke 23:23-25 (NLT)

Pilate saw that he wasn't getting anywhere and that a riot was developing. So he sent for a bowl of water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood. The responsibility is yours!"

Matthew 27:24 (NLT)

Pilate's <u>selfish ambition</u> led him to <u>abandon</u> <u>his duty</u>.

Jesus' singular ambition led Him to fulfill His.

²⁸ So, Jesus said, "When you have lifted up the Son of Man on the cross, then you will understand that I AM he. I do nothing on my own but say only what the Father taught me. ²⁹ And the one who sent me is with me—he has not deserted me. For I always do what pleases him." John 8:28-29 (NLT)

⁹ Cheerfully pleasing God is the main thing, and that's what we aim to do, regardless of our conditions. ¹⁰ Sooner or later we'll all have to face God, regardless of our conditions. We will appear before Christ and take what's coming to us as a result of our actions, either good or bad.

2 Corinthians 5:9-10 (MSG)



When we look at the events surrounding Jesus, one thing is very clear... God genuinely cares about all people. That means everybody, not just the 'good' ones. Jesus was sent to earth with a very specific plan of action: to seek and save the lost.
