


#### TAKE HOME SHEET

Message: Taming Our Tongues

Review the notes from this week's message.

What impacted you the most?

Reread James 3:1-12. In general, speaking life is more than just using positive words. It's speaking truth in love for the benefit of the listener, the recipient of the message. Why do you think we are prone to speak both blessings and curses? Why is this an odd characteristic for someone that is a follower of Jesus?

Read Matthew 12:35-36. Why is it important to examine our speech?

In taming our tongues, we must first surrender our lives to God, lean on Him for help and choose to use words that are from His perspective. Think about your normal responses to life situations and your everyday interactions with friends, family, colleagues or neighbors (social media platforms included). What do your statements reveal about your heart? What needs to change? What needs to continue?

Read Matthew 5:23-24. Cleaning up where we messed up implies that we initiate reconciliation with the neighbors we have offended. Take a moment to pray and ask God if there is anyone you need to reach out to apologize and ask forgiveness. Make a list and an action item to reconcile before the week ends. Share your experience with your small group or a trusted resource in what God did during the moment of reconciliation.



<sup>1</sup> Dear brothers and sisters, not many of you should become teachers in the church, for we who teach will be judged more strictly. 2 Indeed, we all make many mistakes. For if we could control our tongues, we would be perfect and could also control ourselves in every other way. 3 We can make a large horse go wherever we want by means of a small bit in its mouth. 4 And a small rudder makes a huge ship turn wherever the pilot chooses to go, even though the winds are strong. <sup>5</sup> In the same way, the tongue is a small thing that makes grand speeches. But a tiny spark can set a great forest on fire. 6 And the tongue is a flame of fire. It is a whole world of wickedness, corrupting your entire body. It can set your whole life on fire, for it is set on fire by hell itself. 7 People can tame all kinds of animals, birds, reptiles, and fish, 8 but no one can tame the tongue. It is restless and evil, full of deadly poison. 9 Sometimes it praises our Lord and Father, and sometimes it curses those who have been made in the image of God. 10 And so blessing and cursing come pouring out of the same mouth. Surely, my brothers and sisters, this is not right! 11 Does a spring of water bubble out with both fresh water and bitter water? 12 Does a fig tree produce olives, or a grapevine produce figs? No, and you can't draw fresh water from a salty spring.

James 3:1-12 (NLT)

<sup>35</sup> A good person produces good things from the treasury of a good heart, and an evil person produces evil things from the treasury of an evil heart. <sup>36</sup> And I tell you this, you must give an account on judgment day for every idle word you speak.

#### **How to Tame My Tongue**

#### 1. Surrender my life to God.

<sup>1</sup> And so, dear brothers and sisters, I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. <sup>2</sup> Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think.

#### 2. Select my words from God's perspective.

Post a guard at my mouth, GOD, set a watch at the door of my lips.

Too much talk leads to sin. Be sensible and keep your mouth shut.

Instead, we will speak the truth in love...

Ephesians 4:15 (NLT)


#### 3. Clean up when you mess up.

Finally, I confessed all my sins to you and stopped trying to hide my guilt. I said to myself, 'I will confess my rebellion to the LORD.' And you forgave me! All my guilt is gone.

Make this your common practice: Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you can live together whole and healed.
