What failures have you felt guilt and shame about?

Is there a time when you were "exposed" that you felt similarly?

After Jesus' resurrection [John 21:1-14]

How do you think Jesus felt about Peter when he repeatedly failed?

What did Peter deserve?


What did he get?

The last supper

[John 13:1-17; 33-38]

It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love.

John 13:1 (NIV)

Jesus <u>tells and shows</u> how to <u>live and love</u> as His humble followers...so others can know Him!

After the supper...in the garden [Mark 14:32-42]

When Jesus asks for help, Peter <u>utterly fails</u> Him.

Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Simon," he said to Peter, "are you asleep? Could you not keep watch for one hour?"

Mark 14:37 (NIV)

Amazingly, Jesus doesn't <u>demand</u>, get <u>derailed</u> or ditch him.

After His arrest...in the courtyard [Luke 22:54-62]

Peter realizes that Jesus fully knows his brokenness, failure and shame.

⁶¹ The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: "Before the rooster crows today, you will disown me three times." ⁶² And he went outside and wept bitterly.

Luke 22:61-62 (NIV)

After Jesus' resurrection...on the beach [John 21:1-14]

Peter's failure is <u>forgiven</u>, but can Jesus' vision for him be restored?
